NOTING ACC WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

FOUR ACC TEAMS RANKED IN AP POLL

- Four ACC women's basketball teams are ranked in the latest Associated Press Top 25 Poll, tied for the second most of any conference.
- Reigning ACC Champion NC State headlines the group at No. 2, while 2020-21 regular-season champion Louisville is also among the top 10 at No. 10. Notre Dame enters the poll for the first time this season and is No. 24, while Florida State rounds out the poll at No. 25. Duke, Georgia Tech, North Carolina and Virginia Tech also received votes.
- In the USA TODAY/Coaches Poll, NC State is No. 3, followed by No. 5 Louisville and No. 25 Notre Dame. Florida State, Georgia Tech, North Carolina and Wake Forest received votes.
- The ACC's eight teams receiving votes in the AP and USA TODAY/Coaches poll are both the most of any conference.

2021 BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE

- Two of the nation's premier women's basketball conferences will again square off for hardwood bragging rights in the 14th Big Ten/ACC Women's Basketball Challenge which takes place Wednesday, Dec. 1 and Thursday, Dec. 2.
- The annual challenge, which was not played in 2020, returns this fall and offers 14 high-quality matchups for the seventh time.
- The ACC owns a 9-1-3 all-time advantage in the Challenge, headlined by three outright titles in the last four years the event has been held. Additionally, the ACC stands a collective 94-70 against the Big Ten in the Challenge.
- Twelve of the 14 games will air live on a linear television network, including all seven ACC home games.
- A pair of matchups feature two ranked teams, as No. 10 Louisville hosts No. 12 Michigan and second-ranked NC State travels to sixth-ranked Indiana. Both matchups will be televised nationally on ESPN and ESPN2.

ACC, BIG TEN & PAC-12 ANNOUNCE ALLIANCE MENTAL HEALTH INITIATIVE

- The ACC, Big Ten, and Pac-12 have announced a joint initiative entitled "Teammates for Mental Health," which is designed to raise awareness about the importance of mental health and wellness among their more than 27,000 student athletes.
- This initiative builds upon the work all three conferences continue to dedicate toward mental health, including the creation of dedicated task forces and cabinets comprised of mental health professionals on campuses at the 41 world-class institutions that comprise the ACC, Big Ten, and Pac-12.
- The ACC, Big Ten, and Pac-12 are again coming together to officially tip off Teammates for Mental Health starting with the 2021 Big Ten/ACC Women's and Men's Basketball Challenge, a series of 28 contests November 29-December 2, along with Alliance basketball matchups during the regular season across all three conferences. These Alliance matchups – and others throughout the 2021-22 ACC, Big Ten, and Pac-12 college athletics seasons – will highlight the importance of mental health and wellness.
- The Alliance's Teammates for Mental Health initiative includes a public service announcement (PSA) featuring women's and men's basketball head coaches and the commissioners from all three conferences. The 30-second PSA will air on ESPN, ACC Network, Big Ten Network, and Pac-12 Network, as well as on conference-owned digital and social media channels.
- Additionally, starting with the 2021 Big Ten/ACC Women's and Men's Basketball Challenge, Alliance games will feature Teammates for Mental Health public address announcements, digital signage, coaches' lapel pins, and promotions that help serve fans' mental health and wellness needs.

STRONG START FOR ACC TEAMS

- ACC teams have enjoyed a strong start to the 2021-22 season, as the league's 15 teams have combined to compile a 72-23 overall record.
- The 72 wins and .758 winning percentage are the second most of any conference.

SHOOTING IT WELL

- Six ACC teams rank among the nation's top 25 in field-goal percentage - the most of any conference.
- NC State leads the league at 48.6 to rank eighth nationally, while Duke is No. 12 with a 48.3 clip.
- Notre Dame is shooting 47.4 to rank 17th, while Florida State (47.3) is No. 18. Boston College and Virginia Tech are tied for 19th, each with a 47.2 field-goal percentage.

STELLAR DEFENSIVELY

- The ACC's five teams among the nation's top 12 in scoring defense are the most of any conference.
- Louisville leads the group at No. 2, limiting opponents to just 42.8 points per game.
- Georgia Tech (43.8) and North Carolina (44.3) are also among the top five at fourth and fifth, respectively.
- Wake Forest is No. 11 at 48.7 ppg and Virginia Tech is 12th at 49.0.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

- Eight ACC teams rank among the nation's top 25 in rebound margin - the most of any conference.
- North Carolina headlines the conference at No. 9 with a

14.0 margin, Wake Forest is No. 11 at 13.7 and Pitt is No. 12 at 13.6.

- NC State is averaging 13.4 more rebounds than its opponents to rank 13th, Georgia Tech is 17th (12.8) and Duke is 20th (11.8).
- Virginia Tech and Louisville round out the top 25 for the ACC at 11.7 to tie for 22nd.

MIAMI'S MEIER MAKES HISTORY

- Head Coach Katie Meier became the winningest head coach in Miami basketball history on Tuesday, Nov. 9, with a 72-67 victory against Jackson State.
- She passed Hurricanes legend and UM Hall of Famer Ferne Labati with her 304th win as the head coach of the Hurricanes.
- In 17 seasons, Meier has compiled a 307-200 record with Miami including 11 postseason appearances, nine 20-win seasons and eight NCAA Tournaments.

STRONG RETURNERS

- Eight of the conference's top-10 scorers from last season return for the 2021-22 season.
- Eleven All-ACC performers return from a season ago - Boston College's Taylor Soule (First Team), Florida State's Morgan Jones (First Team), Georgia Tech's Lorela Cubaj (First Team) and Lotta-Maj Lahtinen (First Team), NC State's Jakia Brown-Turner (First Team), Elissa Cunane (First Team) and Kayla Jones (First Team), Notre Dame's Maddy Westbeld (First Team), Virginia Tech's Aisha Sheppard (First Team) and Elizabeth Kitley (First Team) and Clemson's Delicia Washington (Second

- Six teams return all five starters from last season: Boston College, Florida State, Georgia Tech, NC State, Pitt and Virginia Tech.

NC STATE SELECTED PRESEASON FAVORITE

- NC State is the 2021-22 Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Basketball preseason favorite, according to separate polls of the league's 15 head coaches and the Blue Ribbon Panel.
- The Wolfpack received 50 of 57 first-place votes from the Blue Ribbon Panel for a total of 847 points and 14 of 15 first-place votes from the league's head coaches to finish with 224 points to lead the voting. NC State has won back-to-back ACC Tournament titles and is the preseason favorite for the first time since the conference began such rankings prior to the 1991-92 season.
- Louisville, which has won the ACC regular-season championship outright or claimed at least a share in each of the past four seasons, received the remaining first-place vote in the head coaches' poll and seven from the Blue Ribbon Panel to finish second in both with 207 and 789 points, respectively.
- Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and Florida State rounded out the top five in both polls.

CUNANE NAMED ACC PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR

- NC State's Elissa Cunane, an Associated Press, ESPN and USBWA All-American following the 2020-21 campaign, was chosen as the ACC Preseason Player of the Year by the head coaches and Blue Ribbon Panel. The Summerfield, North Carolina, native was a first-team All-ACC selection last year and a semifinalist for the Wooden Award, given to the nation's most outstanding player.
- Cunane was named the 2021 ACC Tournament MVP after averaging 23.3 points, 9.0 rebounds and 62.5 percent (25-of-40) shooting in three Wolfpack wins. Her 70 total points marked the fifth-most by a player in a single ACC Tournament in the last 20 years. She ended the season ranked sixth in the ACC in scoring (16.3), fifth in rebounding (8.3), second in field-goal percentage (.533) and third in free-throw percentage (.843).

TALENTED NEWCOMERS

- The ACC welcomes five of the top 20 freshman classes according to ESPN Hoopgurlz.
- North Carolina's incoming class ranks No. 3 to lead the league, while Notre Dame has the fifth ranked class.

ACC COMMITTEE FOR RACIAL & SOCIAL JUSTICE

The ACC Committee for Racial and Social Justice (C.O.R.E.) was created in June 2020 to support the ACC's commitment to social justice and racial equity. Members of C.O.R.E. include conference office staff members and campus representatives from each of the league's 15 institutions. C.O.R.E.'s mission is to promote and encourage racial equity through education, partnerships, engagement and advocacy.

Advocacy

- Implemented a UNITY Week for each season (Fall, Winter, Spring) to showcase the ACC and its member institutions' commitment to and support of racial and social justice.
- Fall – Theme: Activism and Allyship, featured a student-athlete webinar facilitated by the ISSJ.
- Winter – Theme: Leadership Matters, featured the playing of Lift Every Voice and Sing at all ACC Winter Championships.
- Spring – Theme: Activism Through Sports, featured unity walks on various campuses and in Greensboro, webinars with Dr. Joseph Cooper, PhD and Ms. Lonita Baker, JD, and an AD Panel with Dr. Carla Williams, PhD and Heather Lyke, JD.
- Developed a Social Justice Series and PSAs that were shared on ACC platforms featuring student-athletes and coaches speaking out on the need for change.
- Amplified campus and student-athlete participation in peaceful protests and advocacy for racial and social justice issues.
- Instituted the UNITE Award which recognizes, on an annual basis, individuals nominated by each institution that are affiliated with the ACC (student-athletes, alumni, coaches, athletic administrators and/or professionals with ties to the ACC) who have made an impact in areas of racial and social justice.
- Created the ACC unity symbol as a visual representation of solidarity among the ACC's 15 institutions around racial and social justice.
- Instituted the ACC unity statement to be read at conference events to show our collective commitment to unity behind common causes. The statement reads: "We, the ACC, are committed to seeing each other as equals, treating each other with respect and dignity at all times, recognizing that our differences do not divide us, but they make us stronger."
- Implemented the observance of Juneteenth and Election Day as conference office holidays.

Education

- Adopted conference-wide mandatory annual diversity and inclusion training for studentathletes, athletic



department staff, and Conference office staff. This year's training focused on anti-racism.

- Launched an ACC staff book club designed to foster education and dialogue around the topics of racial and social justice. The first series of the book club began August 10, 2020 to read and discuss "So You Want to Talk About Race" by Ijeoma Oluo. The next installment of the ACC staff book club will involve reading and discussing "White Fragility" by Robin DeAngelo.
- Initiated planning for activities that will commemorate Pride Month (June 2021).
- Utilized the monthly internal newsletter to provide educational resources and keep staff updated on C.O.R.E. actions.

Engagement

- Established a Voter Education Campaign that included conference-wide voting challenge to encourage student athletes, coaches, administrators, and staff to exercise their right and civic duty to vote. The campaign included promotion of educational materials and amplification of initiatives being executed on campus. Several campuses served as polling sites for the November 3 Election Day.
- Conducted a Men's and Women's Basketball Suit Drive during both league tournaments that yielded more than 275 suits donated to United Way of Greater Greensboro Family Success Center and other local organizations.

Organizational Culture

- Reviewed department staff makeup, hiring practices and empowerment of diverse hires on campuses and at the Conference office.
- Developed a directory of local minority-owned businesses to encourage staff to utilize these vendors for conference operations.
- Pursuing collaborations with other collegiate athletic entities in our respective community to establish initiatives and programs in our community to bring about change in the areas of diversity, equity, inclusion, and social justice.

Partnership

- Partnered with local organizations, International Civil Rights Center & Museum and United Way of Greater Greensboro's Family Success Centers.

- Louisville's class is ranked No. 20.

ACC ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

- Several ACC student-athletes have recently been named to preseason award watch lists.
- Eight ACC student-athletes are listed among the John R. Wooden Award Women's Preseason Top 50 Watch List. Georgia Tech's Lorela Cubaj and Lotta-Maj Lahtinen, Louisville's Hailey Van Lith, Notre Dame's Maddy Westbeld, NC State's Jakia Brown-Turner and Elissa Cunane and Virginia Tech's Elizabeth Kitley and Aisha Sheppard represent the ACC.
- Louisville's Van Lith, NC State's Cunane and Virginia Tech's Kitley are among the 30 candidates on the Wade Trophy Watch List.
- Louisville's Van Lith and NC State's Diamond Johnson and Raina Perez have named to the 2022 Nancy Lieberman Award Watch List, which recognizes the top point guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball.
- Clemson's Kiara Lewis, Duke's Celeste Taylor, Louisville's Kianna Smith and NC State's Brown-Turner have been named to the 2022 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Watch List, which recognizes the top shooting guard.
- Boston College's Taylor Soule, Duke's Elizabeth Balogun, Louisville's Emily Engstler and North Carolina's Alyssa Utsby have been named to the 2022 Cheryl Miller Award Watch List, which recognizes the top small forwards. The ACC's four selections tie as the most of any conference.
- Georgia Tech's Cubaj, Louisville's Olivia Cochran, NC State's Kayla Jones and Notre Dame's Sam Brunelle have been named to the 2022 Katrina McClain Award Watch List, which recognizes the top power forwards. The ACC's four selections tie as the most of any conference.
- NC State's Cunane, Virginia's Eleah Parker and Virginia Tech's Kitley have been named to the 2022 Lisa Leslie Award watch list, which recognizes the top centers.

ACC AND THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

- The ACC has had at least one No. 1 seed in each of past seven tournaments and 21 times overall. The ACC has had multiple No. 1 seeds in six tournaments (2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2018, 2019).
- At least one ACC team has advanced to the Elite 8 in each of the past 19 NCAA Tournaments with Louisville representing the conference at the 2021 NCAA Tournament, the longest streak of any conference and the next closest is 11.
- In the last four NCAA Tournaments, ACC teams have

earned 31 selections to compete in the field, also the most of any conference.

- Since 2014, the ACC leads all conferences with five appearances in the NCAA title game.
- The ACC also owns the most NCAA Tournament wins (93) of any conference since 2014. The next closest conference has 80.
- ACC member institutions have won three NCAA Championships and made 24 trips to the Final Four. Seven different institutions have represented the ACC in the Women's Final Four.
- Three ACC women's basketball teams advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament with Georgia Tech making its second all-time appearance, Louisville securing its 10th and NC State earning its 14th.
- The ACC is the only conference to have at least three teams in the Sweet 16 in each of the last seven NCAA Tournaments.
- Louisville made its fourth consecutive trip to the Sweet 16, while NC State has advanced in three straight trips.
- Georgia Tech and Louisville logged two of the largest comeback wins by a team in NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament history with the Yellow Jackets overcoming a 17-point deficit against Stephen F. Austin in the first round and the Cardinals erasing an 18-point deficit against Northwestern.

ACC LEADS ALL CONFERENCES WITH EIGHT NCAA SELECTIONS IN 2021

- Eight Atlantic Coast Conference women's basketball teams were selected to compete in the 2021 NCAA Tournament, the most of any conference.
- Florida State, Georgia Tech, Louisville, North Carolina, NC State, Syracuse, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest earned bids to participate in the event.
- It marked the third consecutive NCAA Tournament that the ACC has had eight teams selected, leading all conferences each year and matching the ACC record for teams in the field (2014-15, 2018-19).
- NC State is a No. 1 seed for the first time in program history and earned its 26th appearance in the field, including its fourth consecutive.
- Louisville owns the longest active NCAA streak of any conference team with its 10th consecutive trip and 23rd overall.
- Georgia Tech and Virginia Tech made their 10th trip to the NCAA Tournament. It was the first for the Hokies since 2006 and first for the Yellow Jackets since 2014.
- Florida State and Syracuse made the field for the eighth consecutive time, with the Seminoles earning the 19th selection in program history and the Orange claiming

• Wake Forest was selected for the second time and the first appearance for the program since 1988. North Carolina secured its conference-leading 28th NCAA selection and second consecutive.

ACC TOURNAMENT RECAP

• NC State claimed its second consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Basketball Tournament championship on Sunday, March 7, turning back Louisville in a dramatic title game that lived up to its billing.
 • The second-seeded Wolfpack prevailed 58-56 in what will be remembered as one of the tournament's more fantastic finishes. Raina Perez's 17-foot jumper with 2.1 seconds remaining snapped a tie score, and ACC Player of the Year Dana Evans missed a 3-point try at the buzzer that would have won it for the top-seeded Cardinals.
 • NC State earned the conference's automatic NCAA Tournament qualifying spot while securing back-to-back ACC Tournament championships for the first time in program history.
 • Prior to winning each of the last two years under head coach Wes Moore, the Wolfpack's previous tourney titles came in 1980, 1985, 1987 and 1991 under the legendary Kay Yow.
 • Wolfpack junior center Elissa Cunane, who averaged 23.3 points and nine rebounds in NC State's three wins, was named the ACC Tournament's Most Valuable Player.
 • The average margin of victory in the 12 ACC Women's Basketball Tournament games was just 7.5 points.
 • Seven of the 12 games were decided by less than 10 points, headlined by the two-point NC State win over Louisville in the championship game. The largest margin of victory for any team in the tournament was just 13 points.
 • The 2021 ACC Women's Basketball Tournament marked the 44th edition of the longest running conference women's basketball championship in the nation and it was the 21st time in the last 22 years that the Greensboro Coliseum has hosted the event.
 • The Coliseum, with assistance from the Greensboro Sports Foundation, Greensboro Sports Commission and Convention and Visitors Bureau, is set to play host to the tournament through 2023.

INSIDE ACC ACTION

• The ACC played 163 of 199 regular-season scheduled women's basketball games (81.9%) last season.
 • In the 106 conference games played, the home team won 67 games and the road team won 39.
 • The average margin of victory in ACC games was 12.1 points.
 • Forty-seven of the 106 games were decided by 10 points or fewer and 25 games were decided by five points or fewer.

ACC & THE WNBA

• For the 16th consecutive year, the Atlantic Coast Conference had at least one student-athlete selected in the first round of the WNBA Draft, as the 2021 edition was held on April 15 and broadcast live on ESPN. That streak is the most of any conference and the next closest is seven.
 • In the past five years, the conference has had 38 players selected in the draft - the most of any conference.
 • The ACC led all leagues with 27 players on WNBA rosters and 22 players on WNBA Playoff rosters this season. Both were the most of any conference.
 • The ACC's 11 former student-athletes on the four semifinal playoff teams (Chicago Sky, Connecticut Sun, Las Vegas Aces and Phoenix Mercury) were also the most of any conference.
 • Duke's Lexie Brown and Louisville's Dana Evans won the 2021 WNBA Championship as members of the Chicago Sky.

• Duke's Chelsea Gray and Notre Dame's Skylar Diggins-Smith and Jewell Loyd donned the Red, White and Blue as Olympians this past summer. The ACC's three selections were the second most of any conference.
