Mustangs Begin Five-Game Homestand

SAN LUIS OBISPO, Calif. — After 13 days off following its season-opener against Santa Clara, the Cal Poly women's basketball team will begin a stretch of five consecutive home games starting Tuesday against No. 10 Louisville followed by St. Thomas on Thursday and Montana State on Friday as part of its annual Holiday Beach Classic.

The Mustangs (0-1) will host the No. 10 Cardinals (3-1) at 5 p.m. Tuesday at Mott. They will then face St. Thomas Friday at 12 p.m. and Montana State Saturday at 2:30 p.m. All three games will be streamed live on ESPN+ with Cal Poly's Daniel Gillman and Zachary Anderson-Yoxsimer on the call. Links for that as well as audio and live stat links can be found on the schedule page.

In addition to Cal Poly's games, there will be another game each day Friday and Saturday as part of the Holiday Beach Classic. Montana State will play North

Texas at 2:30 p.m. Friday and North Texas will face St. Thomas at 12 p.m. Saturday. Admission is free to all fans for all four of the Holiday Beach Classic games.

In its lone game of the season so far on Nov. 10, Cal Poly fell on the road at Santa Clara, 77-91. Three Mustangs scored in double figures, led by junior guard Maddie Willett's 18 points. Cal Poly's other double-digit efforts came from a pair of freshmen guards. Sydney Bourland finished with 13 points and four steals while Annika Shah added 10 points.

Cal Poly shot the ball well, shooting nearly 53-percent from the floor and 43-percent from three. However, the Mustangs committed 20 turnovers including 19 in the first three quarters which Santa Clara turned into 17 points.

Willett is Cal Poly's leading returning scorer from last season after she finished third on the team in scoring at 7.8 points per game. The Mustangs lost their top two leading scorers from the last two seasons in Sierra Campisano and Abbey Ellis. Willett started 23 of the 24 games last year and made the second most threes on the team with 25.

This year's Mustang team welcomes eight newcomers, including six freshmen and two Division I transfers. Last season, Cal Poly finished 13-11 overall and 8-8 in Big West play for a sixth-place finish in the Big West. In the Big West Conference Tournament, the Mustangs beat Long Beach State 61-60 in the quarterfinals before falling to UC Irvine in the semifinals.

Louisville comes into Tuesday's game having won three in a row after losing their opening game of the season to No. 22 Arizona. On Saturday, the Cardinals picked up a 61-53 win over

Washington in Seattle. Louisville has been led so far this season by guard Hailey Van Lith's 10.8 points per game and forward Emily Engstler's 10.5 points per game. Louisville's third-leading scorer at 9.8 points per game is guard Kianna Smith. She is the daughter of Cal Poly men's basketball head coach John Smith. This will be the first meeting in women's basketball between the two schools. This will be the first time a nationally-ranked opponent has come to Mott Athletics Center since the women's volleyball team hosted No. 9 UCLA in 2018.

St. Thomas comes into the week 1-3 and split of a pair of games last week. They beat South Carolina State 65-50 before falling to Presbyterian College 82-62. St. Thomas is in its first year as a Division I school after making the rare jump from Division III. They have been led in scoring this year by a pair of guards averaging 11.7 points per game in Jade Hill and Erin Norling. This will be the first all-time meeting between the schools.

Montana State heads into the week 1-4 on the season and have lost their last four games. Last week, they fell to South Dakota State 78-49 and North Dakota 89-85. The Bobcats have been led in scoring this season by guard Darian White's 12.8 points per game. This will be the third all-time meeting with Montana State. The series is tied 1-1 with the Bobcats winning the last matchup on Dec. 20, 2016 71-52 in Bozeman.

Brown Nearing Program Record: Kirsty Brown, a fifth-year player, needs to play in just 22 more games to become the Mustangs' program leader in career games played. The record is 124 and she currently sits at 103.

Returning Mustangs: The Mustangs return a total of eight players from last season. Those include junior guard Maddie Willett who started 23 of 24 games last year and was third on the team in scoring at 7.8 points per game and had seven games in which she scored double figures.

Senior forward Kirsty Brown returns for her fifth season. Last year, she was fourth on the team in scoring 6.4 points per game, second in rebounding at 5.6 per game, and had three double-doubles.

Junior guard Maddie Vick played in all 24 games last season and came off the bench to lead the team in assists per game at 2.8. She also ranked third in the Big West in assist-to-turnover ratio at 2.6.

New Stangs: Cal Poly will have plenty of youth on this year's team as they welcome six freshmen. The Mustangs also added two Division I transfers in red-shirt freshman guard Sarah Dumitrescu from Ole Miss and junior forward Julia Nielacna from San Francisco.

At USF, Nielacna was second on the team in scoring as a freshman in 2019-20. Last year, she averaged 8.0 points per game while shooting 44-percent from the field and 35-percent from three.

As a freshman last season at Ole Miss, Dumitrescu averaged 4.5 points and 7.3 rebounds per game in six games before missing the rest of the season due to injury.

FAITH MIMNAUGH

Head Coach
25th Season
North Carolina State, 1994

Faith Mimnaugh enters her 25th season as head coach of the Cal Poly women's basketball program having led the Mustangs to the Big West Tournament semifinals in three of the last four years, as well as to either the NCAA Tournament or WNIT four times since 2011.

In 2021, Mimnaugh directed the Mustangs to the semifinals of the Big West Tournament in Las Vegas after a buzzer-beater victory in the quarterfinals over Long Beach State. Both forward Sierra Campisano and guard Abbey Ellis were named First Team All-Conference selections after each averaged better than 15 points per game for the season.

In 2020, Cal Poly opened the conference tournament with back-to-back wins, advancing to the semis at the Honda Center prior to the cancellation of the remainder of play due to COVID-19. During the pair of victories en route to Anaheim, the Mustangs saw Big West All-Freshman selection Abbey Ellis average 25.0 points, while All-Conference First Team honoree Sierra Campisano added 22.0 per game.

Ellis ranked 13th around the country in scoring among all freshmen nationally, while Campisano moved to No. 7 in school history for single-season scoring, culminating a year which saw the Mustangs set to face UC Davis with a trip to the title game on the line, before the stoppage.

Mimnaugh has coached Cal Poly to a 122-88 mark in conference play since 2009 — No. 2 in the Big West in that time span — also including a 2018 season which saw the Mustangs finish second in the Big West standings at 11-5

while going 17-12 overall.

As the 2018 Mustangs secured a double-bye, Dynn Leauepepe averaged 20.7 points per game to rank No. 20 nationally in scoring. College Sports Madness' National Mid-Major Player of the Week on Jan. 8, 2018, Dynn graduated No. 3 in school history for career scoring, while her twin sister, Lynn Leauepepe, graduated as the No. 5 all-time rebounder. Both Leauepepe twins have gone on to successful pro careers overseas, with Dynn honored as the 2019 Dameligaen Player of the Year as a rookie for BK Amager (Kastrup, Denmark) prior to signing with Spanish LF2 club BAXI Ferrol; while Lynn signed with C.B. Jauris in Spain in 2020 after winning the Big V (Victoria, Australia) Youth Player of the Year accolade in her debut for the Sunbury Jets.

Meanwhile, off the court, Mimnaugh's players have earned All-Academic honors from the conference 66 times, while Cal Poly women's basketball achieved 100-percent Graduation Rates in both 2017 and 2018.

Additionally, Mary Kate Evans was named the overall Cal Poly Women's Scholar-Athlete of the Year in both 2017 & 2018. Evans, a grad in BioMedical Engineering, was selected

for Academic All-District Second-Team honors in February 2018, making her one of 12 student-athletes representing 46 Division I universities.

Altogether, Mimnaugh has seen her players named to the all-conference team 51 times, plus 11 all-freshman honors, 13 all-tournament selections and 50 player-of-the-week accolades through the 2020-21 season. From 2001 to 2019, Mimnaugh has also seen nine of her players receive the Big West Best Hustle Award.

Simultaneously since 2015, the Mustangs have made 19 appearances on WatchESPN and have played in front of four of the five largest home crowds in program history, each between 1,839 and 2,047 fans, part of a 111-54 Cal Poly performance at home (.673) since 2008.

During the 2014-15 season, Cal Poly guard Ariana Elegado was chosen as one of 30 Senior CLASS Award candidates across the country, while teammate Kristen Alé went on to play for the American Samoa National Team. A year earlier, the Mustangs reached the Conference Tournament Championship Game for the fourth time in a six-year span. While averaging a double-double, Molly Schlemer earned her second consecutive all-conference first-team

status.

In 2013, Schlemer was named a FullCourt mid-major All-America honorable mention after finishing 10th in the country in field-goal percentage (54.2) while also being selected as the Conference Player of the Year and Big West Tournament MVP. After defeating Pacific in the Big West Tournament Championship, Cal Poly advanced to the NCAA Tournament where the Mustangs took on No. 3 seed Penn State, falling in the first round at LSU.

Previously in 2012, the Mustangs won their second regular-season conference title in a row. Kristina Santiago was fifth in the country in scoring at 23.4 points per game while becoming Cal Poly's all-time leading scorer (1,953) and rebounder (851). Also in 2012, Jonae Ervin etched her name into the NCAA record book by tying to lead the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio, at 2.67.

Mimnaugh was honored with her second Big West Coach of the Year award in 2011 after the Mustangs finished in first place. Cal Poly ranked 10th in the nation in 3-point shooting that season, led by Rachel Clancy, a guard who not only earned the Big West Player of the Year award but also was a third-team Academic All-American. Clancy went on to play professionally for Real Canoe Natación in Spain.

Santiago, who earned an AP All-American honorable mention, became a professional star overseas, winning

three straight Bulgarian playoff MVP awards as her club, Dunav 8806, won a three-peat of NBL championships from 2013-15. Just as Clancy and Santiago before her, Schlemer also has excelled professionally in Europe. Combined for her career, Schlemer was awarded EuroBasket Player of the Week awards on six separate occasions between the German DBBL, Turkish TKBL & Greece A1.

Mimnaugh played at Loyola Chicago (1981-85) and remains the Ramblers' career assists leader (1,000). The 316 assists Mimnaugh handed out during her 1984-85 senior season not only led the nation, but are still the 11th-highest single-season total in NCAA Division I history. Her 11.7 per-game figure as a senior remains the second-best average in Division I history. A four-year All-Mid-Suburban League and three-time all-area selection at Elk Grove High School in Illinois, Mimnaugh (1977-81) assisted the Grenadiers to the 1981 Class AA state championship. Selected to the 1981 all-state team, she helped Elk Grove compile an 84-22 mark during her four-year prep career.

Mimnaugh — inducted into the Loyola Hall of Fame in 1992 and the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2007 — began her professional career with the Newcastle (Australia) Scorpions, serving as a guard and player-coach from 1987-89.

She was then an assistant coach at North Carolina State from 1989-93. With the Wolfpack, she oversaw the operation of a program that reached as high as No. 2 in the national polls.

While working under legendary head coach Kay Yow (the 1988 U.S. Olympic coach), Mimnaugh helped propel the team to the 1990 ACC title and the 1991 ACC Tournament championship. The University of Evansville named Mimnaugh its head coach in 1993, and she led the Purple Aces in their move from the Midwestern Collegiate Conference up to the Missouri Valley. Mimnaugh, who competed with Athletes in Action in 1985 and is a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, came to San Luis Obispo to serve as Karen Booker's top assistant in 1996-97. Aside from her coaching duties at the time, she spearheaded the Mustangs' weight-training program and assisted with recruiting.

Mimnaugh is a certified strength & conditioning specialist, credentialed through the National Strength and Conditioning Association, and is also a member of the U.S. Weightlifting Federation.

She earned her master's degree in sports administration from N.C. State in 1994.
