GETTING STARTED

THE CAPTAINS

Graduate students Caroline Blalock and Sarah Blalock, senior Kirsten Parker and juniors Maggie Foster and Sydney Kirchenheiter will serve as captains for the 2022 season. It marks the fifth season Caroline Blalock will serve as a captain and the second season for Sarah Blalock.

■ Caroline Blalock has been a captain since first stepping foot on campus. As a freshman captain, she was named All-ACC Second Team after leading the team with 43 goals, 55 points and 24 caused turnovers. As a sophomore, she was named ACC All-Academic Team and her 23 caused turnovers ranked third on the team, eighth in the ACC and tied for 10th in UofL single season history. As a junior, she was named preseason All-ACC and led the team with 20 ground balls, sixth in the conference, in the shortened season. Last season, she was named IWLLCA All-Region Second team and All-ACC Second team after leading the team with 11 assists, 32 ground balls, 39 draw controls and 21 caused turnovers.

■ Sarah Blalock was named to the IWLLCA All-Region Second Team last season after recording 12 ground balls and 10 caused turnovers and is considered one of the best defenders in the country. She capped off the 2020 season with five ground balls, six caused turnovers, and six draw controls including a season-high two goals versus Michigan. She led the team with 50 draw controls as a sophomore, and the nine she had against Ohio State marked the most draws for any UofL player during the 2019 season. Her career-high four goals came in UofL's game against Virginia in 2019.

■ Parker has appeared in 34 games, making five starts in three years. She has recorded six goals, three assists, seven caused turnovers and 15 draw controls as a Cardinal.

■ Kirchenheiter played in all 16 games with 12 starts as a sophomore in 2021. She finished the season with nine ground balls, seven caused turnovers and one draw control. As a freshman, she played in all nine games, starting two, and tallied eight ground balls, two caused turnovers and one draw control.

■ Maggie started all 16 games as a sophomore last season. She finished with 23 ground balls and nine caused turnovers, recording at least one ground ball in 12 of 16 games. As a freshman, Foster played in all nine games, starting eight, and tallied 15 ground balls, five caused turnovers and one draw control in the shortened season.

TEETER ENTERS FIFTH SEASON AT LOUISVILLE

Head coach Scott Teeter enters his fifth season at Louisville. He has a 166-160 record in 20 seasons as a head coach and is 21-40 in his five seasons at Louisville.

ABOUT DENVER

Denver was unanimously selected as the BIG EAST women's lacrosse preseason favorite. Denver also had three players named the preseason All-Big East Team: attack Bea Behrins and defenders Sammie Morton and Sam Thacker. Denver claimed its first BIG EAST Championship crown in 2021, ending a string of three-straight years as runner-up. The Pioneers went 16-2 overall and 10-0 in BIG EAST play. Denver made its third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament, earning its fifth bid overall, and advanced to the Round of 16. The Pioneers boasted one of the top defenses in the country, surrendering just 9.39 goals per game to rank 10th nationally, while tallying the third-highest caused turnovers per game clip at 12.56. Among Denver's top returners are Preseason All-BIG EAST Team selections graduate student attacker Bea Behrins (unanimous), graduate student defender Sammie Morton and junior defender Sam Thacker. Behrins is the reigning BIG EAST Attacker of the Year and was just named to the Tewaaraton Award Watch List.

■ **Series History** - UofL is 3-5 all-time against Denver and 1-3 in Denver. The last meeting in Denver was an 18-2 loss on Feb. 16, 2019. Last year, UofL fell 15-6 at UofL Lacrosse Stadium. The Cardinals have lost four straight to Denver with their last win a 14-3 victory in Louisville on Feb. 20, 2016.

■ **Last Meeting (Feb. 15, 2020)** - Louisville could not overcome No. 9 Denver and dropped a 15-6 decision in its home opener. Caroline Blalock led the Cardinals with four points on two goals and two assists, while Alex McNicholas registered a goal and an assist for two points. Goalkeeper Rachel Florek finished the game with 13 saves.

CAROLINE BLALOCK NAMED TO TEWAARATON AWARD WATCH LIST

Caroline Blalock was named to the 2022 Tewaaraton Award watch list. The list includes the top players across all three divisions of NCAA lacrosse and highlights the early contenders for the 2022 Tewaaraton Award. Blalock is a five-year captain for the Cards. Last year, she led the Cards in assists (11), ground balls (32) and draw controls (39), and ranked second in goals (30) and points (41).

■ Last season, she became the 10th player in Louisville program history to accumulate 100 goals (she has 108 goals). She ranks third all-time in UofL program history with 79 caused turnovers, fourth with 130 ground balls, fifth with 38 assists and sixth with 106 draw controls.

MORE ON SARAH BLALOCK

Sarah Blalock is one of the best lockdown defenders in the country and often is responsible for face guarding the opposition's best offensive threat. Last season, she limited Boston College's Charlotte North to one goal in game 1 and scoreless in game 2, Marquette's Megan Menzuber to one goal and Cincinnati's Monica Borzillo to zero goals and one assist.

CARDS IN THE OPENER

Following the tough overtime loss at Colorado, Louisville is 10-5 all-time in season openers and 5-3 in the past eight.

■ Louisville is now 3-4 in season-opening road games. This marked the fourth time in five seasons, all under head coach Scott Teeter, that they opened the season on the road. They are 2-2 in season-opening road games under Teeter. All-time, the Cardinals are 8-7 in their first road game of the season.

IN THE POLLS

In the initial US Lacrosse Magazine Top 20 poll, Louisville is just outside of the Top 20 and second amongst teams receiving votes.

■ Louisville was ranked No. 21 by US Lacrosse Magazine in its annual early Early Top 25 column. The Cards turned in a 5-11 record last season, but earned the ranking for their marked improvement in the ACC, the toughest league in women's lacrosse.

■ After a 12-9 victory over No. 24 Colorado on Feb. 18, 2021, the Cardinals moved into the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association Top 25 poll at No. 23, marking the first time that Louisville had been ranked in the IWLCA poll since they concluded the 2017 season at No. 20. They remained in both the IWLCA and ILWomen polls the remainder of the season.

RANKED VS. UNRANKED

UofL went 1-11 against ranked teams and 4-0 against unranked teams last season. Over the last four seasons, UofL is 14-5 against unranked teams and 1-24 against ranked teams. UofL had lost 24 straight games against ranked teams until their 12-9 win over No. 24 Colorado on Feb. 18, 2021.

GETTING ON THE BOARD FIRST

Louisville fell 14-13 at Colorado despite Hannah Morris scoring the first goal of the game. Last season, the Cards were 5-1 when scoring first and 0-10 when not. Over the past four seasons, UofL is 11-5 when scoring first and 4-24 when not.

REPLACING RACHEL FLOREK

The Cardinals will have a new face in sophomore Sara Addeche in goal this season, as she looks to fill the void left by three-year starter Rachel Florek. Florek was a stone wall between the pipes, ending her career with the most saves in UofL history with 348, and ranks sixth with a 12.76 goals allowed average, third with a .426 save percentage and fourth with 15 wins.

CARDINALS EXCEL IN THE CLASSROOM

The University of Louisville lacrosse team completed a successful fall semester in the classroom, posting a 3.615 team grade-point average. In addition, 29 earned Red & Black Scholar Athlete status for a 3.25 or better cumulative GPA, while eight players were named to Dean's Scholars for a perfect 4.0 GPA.

BERGAN FOLEY INDUCTED INTO UOFL ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

Foley is the first women's lacrosse player inducted to UofL's Athletics Hall of Fame. She was a prolific scorer, setting the Louisville single-season record with 78 goals in 2011 and her 65 goals scored in 2011 ranks fourth all-time at UofL. Foley is the all-time leader in career goals (265), goals per game (4.08), points (288) and points per game (4.43) and her 265 career goals still ranks seventh all-time in the NCAA.

HEAD COACH SCOTT TEETER

Scott Teeter is entering his fifth season as the head coach at Louisville and his 20th overall after spending the first 15 years at Canisius. Prior to the 2022 season, he signed a contract extension through 2025.

In 2021, Louisville finished 5-11 overall against one of the most challenging schedules in history. The Cardinals played seven games against Top 5 teams and 11 against Top 10 teams. They moved into the IWLCA Top 25 following a 12-9 win over No. 24 Colorado on Feb. 18 and remained in both the IWLCA and ILWomen polls the remainder of the season.

Prior to coming to Louisville, he served as head coach at Canisius for 15 years (2003-2017). Upon his arrival in Buffalo, he took the reins of a team that had won just 11 games in the program's first seven seasons. Under his guidance, he changed the culture of the program and was named MAAC Coach of the Year in just his third season after leading the Griffis to an eight-win improvement in 2005.

In 2011, Canisius won a school-record 14 games and capped the successful campaign with the program's first MAAC Tournament title. The Griffis added postseason championships in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2016 and 2017. In the run from 2011-14, the team became the first school in MAAC history to win four straight conference titles. Canisius also claimed regular-season crowns in 2013, 2015, 2016 and 2017 after sweeping through conference foes without a loss.

He was named the league's coach of the year again in 2015, 2016 and 2017, after becoming the first three teams in MAAC history to post a perfect 8-0 regular-season record.

He left Canisius as the winningest coach in MAAC history.

In addition, Teeter has also served as head coach of the Canadian Under-19 National Team since 2009. He guided the team to a bronze-medal showing during the 2011 championship in Hannover, Germany, before earning the country's first women's field lacrosse title at the 2015 FIL World Championship in Edinburgh, Scotland. Also in 2017, Teeter led the Canadian National team to a pair of silver medals, both at the FIL World Cup held in England and the World Games in Poland.

Teeter was a four-year letter-winner for the Canisius College ice hockey team and graduated with a degree in physical education in 2002. He earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in sport psychology and coaching from Canisius in 2004.

Teeter and his wife, Jennifer, have one daughter, Olivia, and one son, Lucas.

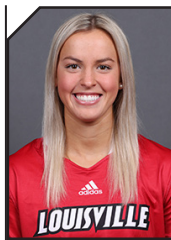
