- Bump BC's record in the series against Louisville to 4-3-0 overall and 2-2-0 on the road.

ABOUT LOUISVILLE

- Louisville enters Friday's contest with an overall mark of 7-4-1 and a record of 3-3-0 in ACC play ... the Cardinals hosted NC State on Sunday afternoon, falling 2-1.
- The Cardinals have picked up ACC wins against Miami (3-2 OT), Syracuse (2-1) and Wake Forest (2-1 OT).
- Nina Nicosia leads the team in scoring with nine points on three goals and three assists ... Emma Hiscock has a team-leading four goals ... all seven of Louisville's game-winning goals have come from different players.
- Goalkeeper Gabby Kouzelos has started all 12 games for Louisville, going 7-4-1 with a .694 save percentage, 1.56 goals against average and two shutouts
- Louisville was tabbed eighth in the 2021 ACC Preseason Coaches Poll.

SERIES HISTORY VS LOUISVILLE

- Boston College has a record of 3-3-0 in the all-time series with Louisville ... the Eagles have a mark of 1-2-0 on the road and 2-1-0 at home against the Cardinals.
- The teams first met on Oct. 12, 2014, with BC traveling to Louisville and earning a 1-0 win.
- Five of the six meetings in the series have featured a shutout ... BC has put up three shutouts to Louisville's two in the series.
- The teams met in Louisville last year, with the Cardinals getting a 2-0 win in what was BC's second game of the season.

UP NEXT

- Boston College will continue its three-game road stretch with a visit to Pitt on Thursday, Oct. 21.
- The Eagles will then head to Virginia Tech on Sunday, Oct. 24 before returning home to host Clemson for the regular season finale on Thursday, Oct. 28.

LAST TIME OUT

• The Eagles went toe-to-toe with No. 5 North Carolina on Sunday afternoon, ultimately falling in overtime. 2-1.

- BC carried the early play and took a 1-0 lead in the 50th minute thanks to Sam Smith's fourth goal of the season ... UNC evened the score late in the half and then scored for the win in overtime.
- Jenna Bike assisted on Smith's goal ... goalkeeper Wiebke Willebrandt made two saves for BC.

IT'S WORTH NOTING

- BC has seven different goal scorers and 17 different point getters on the year.
- Three Eagles have combined for six four-point games for BC this season, with Ella Richards doing it four times and Linda Boama and Samantha Agresti once each.
- Ella Richards ranks fifth in the ACC in points (20) and sits tied for fifth in goals (8).
- Linda Boama is tied for sixth in the ACC in points (19) and fifth in points per game (1.58) while tying for fifth in goals (8) and goals per game (0.67).
- Wiebke Willebrandt's season and career-high 12 saves at No. 1 Florida State on Sept. 18 marked the second most in a game by an ACC goalkeeper this season.
- Willebrandt earned her first career win and shutout in her first career start with four saves at Iona on Aug. 19 ... the last Eagle goalkeeper to do the same was Erin Seppi against Stony Brook on

ACTIVE SCORING LEADERS

- Jenna Bike is BC's active scoring leader with 45 points on 17 goals and 11 assists.
- Sam Smith is the second-highest active scorer with 39 points on 17 goals and five assists.

PUTTING IN THE TIME

- Haley Thomas leads Boston College field players in minutes played with 1,216 while captain Michela Agresti has put in 1,215 ... Thomas has played 90 minutes or more in 11 games this season while Agresti has played at least 90 minutes in 10 games this season, including the last eight straight.
- Sonia Walk has also broken the 1,000-minute mark, putting in 1,073 on the pitch.
- Two other Eagles in Samantha Agresti (923) and Éabha O'Mahony (965) have played over 900 minutes.
- Goalkeeper Wiebke Willebrandt has played all 1,287 minutes for the Eagles.

2021 CAPTAINS

- The Eagles are led by Jenna Bike, Mia Karras and Michela Agresti in 2021.
- This is the second consecutive year that Bike and Karras are captaining the Eagles while Agresti is a first-time captain.
- In 2021, Bike started all 14 contests for the Eagles in her return to the pitch from injury ... the graduate student finished second on the team in scoring with 10 points on four goals and two assists.
- Karras, a graduate student, played and started all 14 of BC's contests last season.
- Agresti started all 32 game that BC played in her first two seasons on the Heights ... the defender has played at least 90 minutes in 31 of 32 games.

HELLO, ELLA

- Ella Richards leads the Eagles with 20 points on a team-high eight goals and four assists.
- The freshman ranks fifth in the ACC in points (20) and sits tied for fifth in goals (8).
- She scored twice against Harvard, UMass and Kennesaw State ... the Chicago native also had a one goal, two assist outing against UConn.
- She scored her first career game-winning goal against UMass.

WELCOME BACK, BOAMA

- Linda Boama has recorded eight goals and three assists for 19 points in 12 games played.
- She is tied for sixth in the ACC in points (19) and fifth in points per game (1.58) while tying for fifth in goals (8) and goals per game (0.67).
- The sophomore began the season by scoring at least one goal in each of the first four games ... she was the first Eagle to score in the first four games of the season since Victoria DiMartino scored in the first four games of the 2009 season.

- Boama has recorded a point in seven out of 12 contests she has played in, including a pair of one goal, one assist outings.
- She converted the first penalty kick attempt of her career at No. 1 Florida State on Sept. 18 ... she added another against Wake Forest.
- · She has three game-winning goals on the year.
- Boama was named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week on Aug. 31 after helping BC to a 3-0-0 week with three goals and two assists.

FIRST THINGS FIRST

- Through the first 14 games of the 2021 season, several Eagles have recorded some firsts.
- In the season opener at Iona on Aug. 19, Linda Boama scored twice, notching the first and second goals of her career with the brace ... also in that game, Ella Richards scored her first career goal while Jessica Carlton and Taliyah Walker picked up their first points with assists.
- Wiebke Willebrandt made her first career start at Iona and earned her first career shutout with four saves.
- Graduate students Haley Thomas and Abby McNamara made their BC debuts at Iona.
- Thomas went on to record her first assist as an Eagle in a win over BU on Aug. 26.
- Abby McNamara scored her first goal as an Eagle in BC's 4-0 win at Kennesaw State on Sept. 5.
- Éabha O'Mahony, Andi Barth, Richards, Sarai Costello, Carlton and Walker all made their collegiate debuts at Iona.
- Costello earned her first career point with an assist against UConn on Aug. 29.
- Andi Barth picked up her first collegiate point with an assist against Holy Cross on Sept. 12.

AN OPENER TO REMEMBER

- Boston College opened up the 2021 season with a 5-0 win at Iona on Thursday.
- Linda Boama scored twice for BC, notching the first and second goals of her career with the brace
- ... Ella Richards and Sam Smith also found the back of the net while the team was credit with a team goal off an Iona defender.
- Wiebke Willebrandt made four saves in her first collegiate appearance for her first career shutout.
- In addition to Willebrandt, Éabha O'Mahony also made her first collegiate start and appearance while Andi Barth, Ella Richards, Sarai Costello, Jessica Carlton and Taliyah Walker all made their collegiate debuts off the bench.
- Graduate students Haley Thomas and Abby McNamara made their BC debuts.

NEW FACES

- Boston College's roster features nine players who weren't on the 2020 roster, with two new graduate transfers and seven new freshmen.
- Haley Thomas (Weber State) and Abby McNamara (Wake Forest) both come to the Heights with four years of collegiate experience.
- Meanwhile Wiebke Willebrandt and Taliyah Walker were on the 2020-21 roster, they did not suit up for the Eagles.
- Additionally, the Eagles have also welcomed a new associate head coach in Taylor Schram and a

Director of Soccer Analytics in Kylie Spencer.

SISTER ACT

- The Eagles have two sets of sisters on the roster this season.
- Samantha and Michela Agresti are in their third season together as Eagles.
- Sophomore Emma Goggins is joined this season by her younger sister, Kate Goggins.

THE 2020-21 QUICK HITS

- The Eagles went 3-10-1, picking up wins over Syracuse (3-1), UAlbany (3-0) and Northeastern (1-0).
- Sam Smith led Boston College in points, goals and assists during the 2020-21 season with 13 points off of five goals and three assists.
- Jenna Bike was second on the team with four goals and two assists for 10 points ... Bike had a team-leading 40 shots and 20 shots on goal.
- Laura Gouvin had a team-leading two game-winning goals and was third on the team with four points on two goals and two assists.
- Allie Augur went 3-9-1 with two shutouts a 1.79 goals against average and .721 save percentage ... Mackenzie Egan saw time in three games, going 0-1-0 with a .727 save percentage and 2.33 goals against average.

ABOUT HEAD COACH JASON LOWE

- Jason Lowe was named the program's fifth head coach on Jan. 9, 2019.
- Lowe arrived on the Heights after serving on the coaching staff at Wake Forest since 2014, including 2017 and 2018 as associate head coach.
- The Shaker Heights, Ohio native helped the Demon Deacons reach the NCAA tournament Round of 32 in 2017 and the Sweet 16 in 2018.
- Prior to Wake Forest, Lowe served as an assistant coach at Alabama for five seasons and two years at Emory.
- Lowe served as a goalkeeper for the Wake Forest men's soccer team from 1994-97.
- In addition to receiving his bachelor's degree from Wake Forest in 1998, Lowe also earned his MBA in 2002.

A BIT ABOUT THE ASSISTANTS

- Jami Kranich is in her third season as an assistant coach on Jason Lowe's staff...Kranich came to BC after two years at Princeton where the Tigers won back-to-back Ivy League titles and advanced to two NCAA Tournaments, including one Elite Eight...Kranich was a four-year starting goalkeeper at Villanova and then played professionally for the Boston Breakers for three seasons.
- Taylor Schram is in her first season as associate head coach at BC, arriving on the Heights after two seasons at Dartmouth...prior to Dartmouth, Schram spent one season as an assistant at Florida Gulf Coast and two seasons at Binghamton, where she helped turn the program around from a last-place finish in the America East in 2016 to an 11-4-4 mark and a conference championship in 2017 along with America East Staff of the Year Honors...Schram played collegiately at Penn State, starting all four years and serving as a captain as a senior.
