

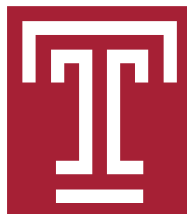

### HEADLINES

> The Temple men's soccer team (5-6-1, 2-1-1 AAC) is on the road again to take on RV Louisville (7-4-2, 2-3-1 ACC) in a late October non-conference match-up. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. at Dr. Mark & Cindy Lynn Stadium as the Owls are set to face their fifth opponent of the season that has been recognized in the national polls.

> Temple is coming off of a critical 3-1 win over conference-foe USF at home on Friday evening. Sophomore Esteban Suarez started the scoring for the Owls and freshman Sean Karani earned his first collegiate brace to propel the squad to its second-straight conference victory.

> Temple is coached by Brian Rowland in his second year at the helm of the program. So far this season, Rowland has led the Owls to a 5-6-1 overall record through an extremely challenging nonconference slate that has already featured three top-15 teams and a win over RV Memphis. The Owls' lone loss in conference play came in their AAC opener on Sept. 27 when they fell to No. 12 UCF, 2-0.

> Louisville is coached by John Michael Hayden in his first season heading the squad after four years on staff as an assistant coach. He's had a memorable first year as head coach as the squad began the year picked No. 14 in the United Soccer Coaches Poll and have continued to be recognized in the the rankings each week since. They've earned a handful of notable victories over perennially talented opponents this season, downing No. 9 Kentucky, 3-0, No. 17 Virginia Tech, 2-1, and No. 2 Georgetown, 1-0. Other than Georgetown, the only opponent that appears on both Temple's and Louisville's schedules is USF, who the Cardinals fell to, 2-0.

> Louisville captured a 3-0 victory over the Owls in teams' lone series meeting back in 2013. At the time, Louisville was ranked 18th in the nation and dished Temple one of just four losses in a 10-4-4 season. It was a conference game, as the Cardinals spent one year in the American during its inaugural season before joining the AAC in 2014.

## NEWS AND NOTES

### Defend this House

> The Owls have been a powerhouse on the defensive end this season, shutting out opponents on three occasions and allowing just 12 goals in as many games played.

> Senior goalkeeper Simon Lefebvre has been phenomenal between the posts for Temple, earning a GAA of 0.97 after saving 31 shots for a save percentage of 72.1%.

### Scouting the Cardinals

> The Cardinals are coming off of a huge 3-2 double overtime thriller against Boston College on Friday night. The Eagles got on the board first in the seventh minute, but Louisville found the 47th -minute equalizer thanks to an Izaiah Jennings goal assisted by Cherif Dieye. After Boston College struck again, Leonard Getz sent the teams into overtime by finding the back of the net in

the 90th minute. Dieye was the hero of the day, finding the golden goal with 5:25 left in double overtime to secure the conference victory for the Cardinals.

> Dieye leads the Louisville offense with six goals and three assists for 15 points. The senior midfielder has fired off 60 shots in his 13 games played, half of which he's put on target, and has netted three game-winning goals for the Cardinals.

> Jake Geinovatch has defended the Cardinals in goal for all 1246 minutes this season. He's allowed 15 goals in 13 games for a goals against average of 1.08 and has accumulated a record of 7-4-2 overall record. He's saved 34 shots fired his way and has posted five shutouts for Louisville so far this year.

### Scouting the Owls

> Temple has found its offensive spark the past two weeks, netting five goals in two games with three coming on Friday against USF. Karani has moved his way up the scoresheets for the Owls, now leading the squad with seven points from three goals and an assist. The freshman has scored in the past two games and earned his first brace during the win over the Bulls.

## **BRIAN ROWLAND**

**Second Season**

**UMBC '03**

Brian Rowland was named the Temple men's soccer head coach in December, 2017. Prior to Temple, he spent eight seasons on the University of Maryland's men's soccer staff with the final three campaigns as the Terps' associate head coach.

Rowland had a statement inaugural season at the helm of the Temple men's soccer program during the fall of 2018. Under his direction, the Owls shined as a fresh program with a 17-man roster change and an entirely new coaching staff from the year prior. The squad displayed its abilities from the gate, as Rowland saw his first victory as head coach in a 1-0 overtime win over the nationally ranked Old Dominion Monarchs in early September. The young, talented group also dished out one of the biggest upsets of the year when they handed the nationally recognized UCF Knights one of just three losses on the season.

Rowland coached three student-athletes to post-season accolades from the American in Lukas Fernandes (Second-Team All-AAC), Jalen Campbell (All-Rookie) and Andres Charles (All-Rookie).

Prior to Temple, Rowland helped coach a Maryland squad that captured five consecutive conference tournament crowns between 2012 and 2016, including three-straight as a member of the Big Ten Conference. Rowland also excelled as a recruiter, helping the Terps bring home top classes on a yearly basis.

The 2017 season saw Maryland start the season 10-0-3 and complete a 30-game regular season unbeaten streak that began in 2015. The Terps boasted the Big Ten Midfielder of the Year Eryk Williamson and first-team All-Big Ten selection Jake Rozhansky. Rowland helped the development of first-year keeper Dayne St. Clair, who was outstanding in his first season as a starter.

In 2016, Rowland helped mentor a league-best eight all-conference selections, including Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year Gordon Wild, Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year Alex Crognale and Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year Cody Niedermeier. Maryland set a program-record for consecutive wins (15) and accomplished an unbeaten regular season (16-0-2). The Terps also garnered the top seed in the NCAA Tournament.

The Terps once again captured the Big Ten Tournament Championship in 2015, defeating top-seeded Ohio State in Columbus. Maryland also made a valiant return to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament after topping previous national champions Virginia and Notre Dame. Six Terps earned all-conference accolades and Tsubasa Endoh (first round) and Ivan Magalhaes (second round) were selected in the 2016 MLS SuperDraft.

Prior to serving as associate head coach, Rowland was tabbed as the recruiting coordinator in 2014, helping to insure the No. 1 rated class in 2015 and No. 2 class in 2016.

Rowland helped guide the Terps to three consecutive regular season and tournament conference championships in 2012, 2013 and 2014 as Maryland advanced to the College Cup in consecutive seasons in 2012-13 for the first time since the 2004 and 2005 seasons.

During his first season in College Park, Rowland coached All-America selection Zac MacMath, who led the nation with a 0.64 goals against average. MacMath was later selected by the Philadelphia Union with the fifth pick overall in the 2011 MLS SuperDraft.

During his undergraduate career, Rowland was a four-year starter for nationally-ranked UMBC and was a two-time captain for the Retrievers. He was tabbed UMBC Male Athlete of the Year, earned All-America honors in 2002, and garnered all-conference accolades twice in his illustrious career. Rowland left UMBC as the career and single-season record-holder in shutouts and was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame in 2014.

Following Rowland's successful collegiate tenure, he continued his playing career with the Toronto Lynx of the USL (2003-04), the Baltimore Blast and Milwaukee Wave of the MISL (2003-07) and finally with Crystal Palace USA of the USL from 2007 to 2009. He was tabbed to MISL's Team of the Week three times and the USL Team of the Week five times. He also spent the last four years as the goalkeeper coach for Crystal Palace, working with academy goalkeepers in a year-round training program.

Prior to landing at UMBC, Rowland competed on the Canadian Youth National U-20 team and trialed at Manchester United and Fulham.

Rowland is a native of Toronto, Ontario and earned his bachelor's degree in economics from UMBC in 2003. Rowland holds a USSF A License (2012) and is involved with US Soccer as a scout for their Youth National Teams.
