STARTING FIVE

■ Louisville held at No. 2 in the latest Associated Press and USA Today polls for the fifth straight week, which matches its highest ever ranking in both polls. It is also the most consecutive weeks that the Cardinals have ever been No. 2 in program history. Five times prior to this season, Louisville has been ranked second in the AP poll, once last season, three times in 2018-19 and once in 2017-18. Six times prior to this season they have been second in the USA Today poll, once last season, three times in 2018-19, once in 2017-18 and at the end of the 2008-09 season.

■ Dana Evans scored 22 points on 11-22 shooting, including four points and a huge steal in the final minute-plus, in the 71-67 win at VT. She had a career-high 29 points on 10-12 shooting, 6-7 from 3-point range and connected on her first six attempts, in the win over UT Martin. She has scored 20-plus points in seven of nine games this season. She now has 19 career 20-point games and UofL is 19-0 in those games. The All-American has scored in double figures in every game this season. She leads the ACC with 20.8 points per game and ranks fifth with 4.3 assists per game.

■ Through nine wins, the Cardinals have a scoring margin of +27.4, which leads the ACC and ranks sixth in the NCAA. Louisville won by a season-high 51 points (W, 97-46) against Bellarmine. They won by 43 points (W, 101-58) against ECU and 41 points (116-75) against No. 20 DePaul. Their smallest margin of victory is four points at Virginia Tech (W, 71-67).

■ The Cardinals feature a balanced scoring attack with four players averaging double digit points per game - Evans (20.8), Hailey Van Lith (13.2), Olivia Cochran (12.6) and Kianna Smith (12.4). Eleven of 12 players are averaging at least 3.4 points per game. Six players scored in double figures in the win over Bellarmine - Cochran (15), Dixon (14), Evans (11), Konno (11), K. Smith (11), Parker (10). It marked first time since Balogun (12), Dunham (12), Evans (12), Shook (12), Jones (11), Dixon (10) vs. Pitt (1/26/20).

■ UofL is averaging 87.4 points per game, which leads the ACC and ranks eighth in the country. They scored a program-record 116 points in the 116-75 win over No. 20 DePaul.

ABOUT THE TIGERS

Clemson is 8-3 overall, 3-3 in ACC play and enters Sunday's contest on a two-game losing streak. The Tigers lost 80-71 at Miami on Jan. 3 and 67-55 vs. Georgia Tech on Thursday. They rank fifth in the league in scoring with 75.2 points per game and sixth in scoring defense, allowing 62.5 points per game. They lead the league and rank third in the country with 236 free throw attempts. Their 152 free throw makes also lead the league, but they are shooting just 64.4 percent from the stripe, which ranks 14th in the ACC. Freshman guard Gabby Elliott leads the Tigers with 14.1 points per game, while ranking second with 5.8 rebounds per game. Redshirt senior Delicia Washington is averaging 13.5 points per game and leads the team with 5.9 rebounds. Redshirt senior Kendall Spray is averaging 11.1 points and is shooting 32-80 (.400) from 3-point range. Her 32 makes rank second in the ACC and third in the NCAA.

■ **Series History** - UofL is 8-3 all-time against Clemson. The Cardinals have won eight straight against the Tigers and all eight wins have come since joining the ACC. Louisville is 2-1 at home against Clemson and 2-0 at the KFC Yum! Center. In the last matchup at the KFC Yum! Center on Feb. 7, 2018, the Cardinals won 65-46.

■ **Last Meeting (Jan. 2, 2020)** - Dana Evans had 27 points with a career-high seven 3-pointers and No. 7 Louisville blew past Clemson 75-50. Evans scored 24 points in the first half as the Cardinals cruised to their fifth straight win overall and eighth in a row over the Tigers. Evans and Elizabeth Balogun, who had 15 points, helped UofL come out fast and put things away early.

QUICK HITTERS

■ **9-0 Start** - UofL is 9-0 for the third time in four years. Last season, UofL won its first seven games before falling at Ohio State. The Cards started 14-0 in 2018-19 and 20-0 in 2017-18.

■ **Busy Week** - Four of nine wins have come over a 7-day stretch starting on New Year's Day.

■ **ACC Play** - UofL is 47-5 in ACC games over the last four seasons. They are 22-3 in home games and 25-2 in road games.

■ **Post Play** - Olivia Cochran and Liz Dixon are shooting a combined 71-115 (.617) from the floor, while averaging a combined 20.3 points and 11.8 rebounds per game.

■ **Trailing in Second Half** - Prior to the 71-67 win at Virginia Tech, UofL had yet to trail in the second half in a game this season. The Cards trailed on four different occasions in the second half and the Hokies largest lead was 67-65 with 2:26 remaining.

■ **We Will Block You** - UofL's 6.2 blocks per game rank second in the ACC and 12th in the NCAA. Elizabeth Balogun is averaging 2.1 blocks per game, which ranks seventh in the ACC.

■ **Protecting the Basketball** - UofL's 13.0 turnovers per game is the second fewest in the ACC and ranks 33rd in the NCAA. The Cardinals +4.8 turnover margin leads the ACC, ranks 36th in country. They committed 15 turnovers in the win at VT with 10 turnovers coming in 3rd quarter.

THE DEEP BALL

UofL shot 5-17 from beyond the arc in Thursday's win over Virginia Tech. They shot 13-26 from deep in the win over UTM on Tuesday. It marked the first time they have shot 50 percent or better from deep this season. Dana Evans (6-7) and Kianna Smith (3-4) shot a combined 9-11 in the win, while Evans hit her first six attempts. Evans (0-5) and Smith (1-5) shot a combined 1-10 at VT. UofL is shooting 32.3 percent (61-189) from 3-pt range, which ranks ninth in the ACC, and 27 of those 61 makes came in wins over UTM and DePaul. UofL shot 14-36 (.389) vs. DePaul.

■ **Dana & Kianna** - Dana Evans ranks ninth in the ACC with 20 made 3-pointers, while her 37.0 3-point shooting percentage ranks 13th. Kianna Smith is shooting 40.0 percent from deep, which ranks eighth in the league, and her 2.0 threes per game rank 14th.

BIG TIME SPURTS

- **vs. ECU** - Used a 16-2 run to start the second quarter to take a 35-14 lead with 5:17 left in the half and put the game away.
- **vs. DePaul** - Leading 26-23 over DePaul with 1:27 to go in the first, UofL used a 33-7 run over the next 10 minutes to build a 59-30 lead with 1:51 to go in the half.
- **vs. UT Martin** - Used an 18-3 run over the final 6:58 of the first half to take a 40-27 halftime lead and break away from a solid Skyhawks team.
- **at Duke** - UofL led by just six midway through the third quarter before going on an 18-5 run to blow the game open and cruise to a 73-49 win.
- **vs. NKU** - The Cardinals trailed the Norse 41-36 with 5:14 to go in the third quarter before ending the quarter on 17-2 and 14-0 runs to take a 53-43 lead.

FRESHMEN OFF TO HOT START

True freshmen Hailey Van Lith (13.2 ppg), Olivia Cochran (12.6) and Merissah Russell (3.9) are contributing 34.0 percent of Louisville's 87.4 points per game. Cochran (6.8) and Van Lith (6.3) rank first and second on the team in rebounds, and with Russell's 3.0 rebounds per game, the trio is accounting for 35.5 percent of the team's 45.4 rebounds per game.

■ **Van Lith** - Van Lith has scored in double figures in eight of nine games. She ranks second on the team with 13.2 points and second with 6.3 rebounds per game. She is shooting 46 percent from the floor and is 12-35 from beyond the arc. Van Lith tied Dana Evans with a team-high 20 points in the win over ECU and became the first UofL freshman to score 20 points in a game since Asia Durr scored 23 in an 80-75 loss to Syracuse in the ACC Tournament semifinals on March 5, 2016. Durr had four 20-point games that season. With 21 points vs. DePaul she became the first UofL freshman with back-to-back 20-point games since Myisha Hines-Allen had 23 points in two straight games against Miami and Syracuse on 1/25-29/15.

■ **Cochran** - Cochran leads the team and ranks 17th in the ACC with 6.8 rebounds per game, while ranking third on the team with 12.6 points per game. She has scored in double figures in six of nine games and three times has double digit rebounds. She is shooting 62.7 percent from the floor, which would lead the ACC, but her 4.7 field goals per game are just short of the qualifying mark.

■ **Double Doubles** - Cochran and Van Lith have a combined three double doubles this year. Cochran had 19 points and 10 rebounds vs. DePaul and 11 points and 12 rebounds at Duke, while Van Lith had 20 points and 11 rebounds against ECU. They are the first freshman with a double-double since Dana Evans had 18 points and 10 assists in 87-63 win at UK on 12/17/17. Cochran is the first freshman with two double-doubles in a season since Shawnta' Dyer in 2011-12. The last freshman with three double-doubles in a season was Ashley Rainey in 2009-10.

WINNING THE CONFERENCE OPENER

Louisville is 6-0 all-time in ACC home openers and has a +7.0 scoring margin. Last season, they won 62-58 against Syracuse on Dec. 29, 2019 in the ACC home opener. This marks the first time that the Cardinals have hosted Clemson in their ACC home opener. This is their latest ACC home opener ever, previously it was a 66-60 win against Duke on Jan. 4, 2018.

70-PLUS POINTS

UofL is 259-23 when surpassing the 70-point plateau under Walz. They have scored 70-plus in all nine wins this season. They went 21-0 when reaching 70 points last year. Their 79-73 loss to Miami in 2018-19 ended a 49-game winning streak when scoring 70-plus points.

50/50

UofL shot above 50 percent in wins over DePaul and Bellarmine. Louisville was 7-0 last year when shooting 50 percent or better. Overall, they boast a 119-1 record when shooting 50 percent or better from the field under Walz. Their lone loss came on Nov. 29, 2008 at Nevada when they shot 50.8 percent (L, 85-82).

APPROACHING MILESTONES

- **Evans Moves Up Scoring List** - Evans has 1,300 career points and is the 15th player in program history to reach 1,300 points. With 22 points at VT, she passed Becky Burke (2008-12) for 15th all-time. She is 65 points shy of passing Mariya Moore (2014-17) for 14th all-time with 1,365 points.
- **Evans From The Stripe** - Evans is shooting 85.6 percent for her career from the free throw line, which is four percentage points ahead of Kristin Maddox's 85.2 percent (1992-96) for the best in program history.
- **Evans From Deep** - Evans has 171 career made 3-pointers, which ranks 10th all-time in program history. She is two away from tying Antonita Slaughter (2010-14) for ninth with 173.

HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ

Head coach **Jeff Walz**, in his 14th season as a head coach, has compiled a 368-104 (.780) record as the Cardinals' leader. He has led Louisville to nine NCAA Sweet 16 appearances, five Elite 8's, three trips to Final 4 (2009, 2013, 2018), two of which culminated with NCAA runner-up finishes (2009, 2013). Walz, who is averaging 27.6 wins per season, became the winningest coach in program history in 2013-14. He also has the most 20-win seasons in school history (12) and the top-seven entries for most victories in a season (36 in 2017-18, 34 in 2008-09; 33 in 2013-14; 32 in 2018-19; 29 in 2012-13 and 2016-17, 28 in 2019-20).



Hired on March 27, 2007, the Bluegrass State native took the program to its first NCAA Sweet 16 and it culminated with Louisville earning the No. 12 ranking in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. For his efforts, Walz was named the WBCA Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the reins at Louisville, Walz spent time on four other coaching staffs: Western Kentucky (1996-97), Nebraska (1997-01), Minnesota (2001-02), and Maryland (2002-07). He helped Maryland win the program's first national title in 2006.

SUCCESS AGAINST UNRANKED TEAMS

UofL is 8-0 against unranked teams this year and 128-2 in their last 130 games. They went 25-2 against unranked teams last year. Prior to the 67-60 loss at Ohio State last season, they had won 102 consecutive games against teams not ranked in the AP Top 25. Their previous loss to an unranked team was a 79-66 setback vs. Dayton on 11/29/15.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

UofL boasts a 157-17 record (.902) at the KFC Yum! Center. All-time at the venue, UofL holds a plus-22.5 scoring margin. Prior to this season's crowd being limited to 15 percent, Louisville was averaging 9,328 fans per contest and had welcomed over one million and a half fans through the doors of the KFC Yum! Center. UofL had won 14 straight games at the KFC Yum! Center prior to its 67-59 loss to FSU on Feb. 6, 2020.

BEST FANS IN THE COUNTRY

UofL welcomed in a season-high 2,754 socially distanced fans in its win over UT Martin Jan. 5. They are averaging 2,159 socially distanced fans this season. They averaged 9,159 fans per game in 2019-20, which topped the ACC and ranked fifth in the country. UofL averaged 9,818 in ACC games, including a season-high 12,086 fans vs. Notre Dame. They welcomed 12,008 fans for the exhibition against the USA National Team.

MOST POINTS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

Louisville's 116 points against DePaul marked the most points in program history, surpassing the 115 points they scored in a 115-51 win over Murray State on Nov. 24, 2017. Per StatsPass.com, Louisville's 116 points is the most points scored by a Division I team in regulation against an AP Top 25 opponent since at least 1999-2000.

■ The 61 points in the first half tied the most points ever in half, matching the 61 they had in the second half of an 88-69 win over Canisius on Dec. 20, 2000.

■ The 40 points in the third quarter marked a program record, surpassing the 37 they had in the third quarter of a 107-52 win over Tennessee State on Dec. 2, 2018 and in the second quarter of a 86-69 win over Hartford on Nov. 24, 2018.

REACHING THE CENTURY MARK IN BACK-TO-BACK GAMES

UofL scored 100 points in back-to-back games against ECU and DePaul, which marked the first time since they won 107-52 vs. Tennessee State on 12/2/18 and 102-62 vs. UT Martin on 12/4/18.

■ UofL has scored 100-plus in consecutive games four times in program history - 2013 (2x), 2018, 2020, but they have never scored 100-plus in three straight games.

MOST FIELD GOALS IN A GAME

Louisville's 49 field goals against DePaul also set a program record, surpassing the 47 they had against Murray State in that 115-51 win. They shot 60.5 percent (49-81) from the field, which is the best field goal percentage since they shot 63.5 percent (40-63) in a 90-72 win over Marquette in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on March 18, 2018.

BIGGEST WIN OVER AN AP TOP 25 TEAM

Louisville's 41-point margin in the win over DePaul marked its biggest win ever against an AP Top 25 team. Its previous high was a 34-point win (86-52) over No. 22 Iowa on Dec. 4, 2014.

THREE CARDINALS WITH 20 POINTS IN THE GAME

Kianna Smith and Hailey Van Lith had 21 points, while Dana Evans added 20 points, in the win over DePaul becoming the first trio to score 20 points in a single game since Jill Morton (24), Sharon Bellamy (24) and Roscelle Bullock (22) did so in an 84-74 win at Memphis on Jan. 22, 1999.

NEWBIES IN THE OPENER

In the win over SEMO, Hailey Van Lith and Olivia Cochran became the first freshmen to start the season opener since Cierra Johnson started in a 100-57 win at UT Martin to begin the 2016-17 season. They were the first duo to start a season opener since Myisha Hines-Allen and Mariya Moore both started in an 89-69 win at IUPUI in 2014-15. Cochran led all scorers with 17 points, while Van Lith chipped in 13 - both becoming the first freshmen to score in double digits in the season opener since Asia Durr scored 12 points in a 75-71 loss to California to open the 2015-16 season. They were the first freshmen duo to both score in double figures in their debut since Moore had 22 and Hines-Allen had 11 in 2014-15.

BEST THREE-YEAR STRETCH IN PROGRAM HISTORY

UofL went 96-11 (.897) over the past three seasons, which marked the fewest losses and best winning percentage over a three-year span in program history. Despite not getting an opportunity to play in the NCAA Tournament last season, the 96 wins over the previous three years rank second all-time to the 97 (97-15) they won during the 2016-17, 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons.

STAYING IN THE AP TOP 10

UofL has remained in the AP Top 10 for 66 straight polls and the USA Today Top 10 for 65 straight polls, both program records. Louisville had remained in the AP Top 5 for 38 consecutive weeks (Nov. 13, 2017-March 18, 2019) prior to being picked ninth in last year's preseason poll. They were in the USA Today Top 5 for 36 consecutive weeks (Nov. 27, 2017-March 18, 2019) before being picked sixth in 2018-19's final poll.

VS. AP TOP 25

UofL is 1-0 against Top 25 teams this season with a 116-75 win over No. 20 DePaul. They went 3-2 against AP Top 25 teams last year and Walz has 65 wins over AP Top 25 teams.

WIN OVER NO. 1

UofL's 72-62 win over No. 1 Oregon last season marked its second ever win over a No. 1 team, first since their 82-81 victory over No. 1 Baylor in the 2013 NCAA Tournament. The Cards are 2-11 all-time against AP No. 1 teams (1-0 vs. Baylor, 1-0 vs. Oregon, 0-10 vs. UConn, 0-1 vs. ND).

TOP FIVE WINS

Louisville went 2-0 against Top 5 teams in 2019-20 and Walz has 12 wins against top five teams in his tenure.

PRESEASON AP AND USA TODAY RANKINGS

UofL was ranked fifth in the AP 2020-21 preseason poll, which equals its highest ever ranking in the poll. The Cardinals received 597 points, 66 points shy of fourth place Baylor. They were also picked fifth in the USA Today poll with 663 points, 39 points shy of fourth place Baylor. UofL also was picked fifth in the preseason AP poll in 2013-14, 2016-17 and 2018-19.

FINISHING WITH 28 WINS

Last year, for the second straight season, Louisville entered postseason play with 27 wins. Despite the NCAA Tournament not taking place, their 28 wins rank seventh all-time in program history. The top seven and 10 of the 11 top win totals in program history have come under Walz.

ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

UofL has recorded at least 20 wins for 10 straight seasons to extend the program record. The longest run previously was three, achieved twice.

The Cards have won at least 20 games in 12 of Walz's 13 seasons. Prior to Walz's arrival, Louisville had just 10 20-win seasons in its history. They have reached the NCAA Tournament nine straight times, which is also the longest stretch in program history.

VAN LITH NAMED ACC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

Hailey Van Lith was named ACC Freshman of the Week after averaging 16.5 points and 9.5 rebounds, and shooting 52 percent from the floor and 6-12 from deep, in her first two games at UofL. She is the first UofL women's basketball player to earn ACC Freshman of the Week honors since Asia Durr did so on Feb. 1, 2016. In her first collegiate game, a 74-53 win at Southeast Missouri, she had 13 points and tied for the team-lead with eight rebounds. Then in her home debut, she put up a double-double with 20 points and 11 rebounds, while shooting 5-9 from beyond the arc.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

■ **Dana Evans** - After being named a WBCA All-American and ACC Player of the Year a season ago, Evans has racked up the preseason honors leading into her senior season. She is one of five Associated Press Preseason All-Americans, ACC Preseason Player of the Year, Preseason First Team All-ACC, while being named to the Naismith Award, Wooden Award and Dyrsdale Award Watch Lists.

■ **Hailey Van Lith** - In addition to being named to the Preseason ACC Newcomer Watch List, Van Lith was named to the Naismith Award and Lieberman Watch List.

■ **Elizabeth Balogun** - Entering her second season at Louisville, Balogun was named to the Miller Award Watch List.

■ **Kianna Smith** - After sitting out last season, Smith was named to the Preseason ACC Newcomer Watch List.

RETURNING POINT PRODUCTION

After losing five players to graduation (Diop, Dunham, Jones, Laemmle, Shook), UofL returns 33.2 points per game, 45.5 percent of their production from a year ago.

RETURNING SHOOTERS

Louisville returns its two top 3-point shooters from last season with Dana Evans and Elizabeth Balogun. The duo made 125 of the 202 made 3-pointers last season, which accounted for 61.9 percent of their made threes. Evans led the ACC with 90 made 3-pointers and shot 43.1 percent, while Balogun made 35 and shot 32.1 percent.

RETURNING STARTERS

The Cardinals return two starters from a year ago (Dana Evans, Elizabeth Balogun). Evans started 29 of 30 games played. She has 35 career starts and is UofL's active leader. Balogun started 26 of 28 games played last season. Elizabeth Dixon made four starts last season, while Mykasa Robinson made three starts a season ago and has five career starts at Louisville. Kianna Smith made 64 starts in 65 games in her two years at Cal, while Balogun and Dixon started all 30 games during their freshman season at Georgia Tech.

GIVE ME FIVE

Louisville returns just five players that saw game action a year ago - Evans, juniors Elizabeth Balogun, Elizabeth Dixon and Mykasa Robinson, along with sophomore Norika Konno. Evans and Robinson are lone players with three or more years of experience with the Cardinals as Evans enters her fourth season and Robinson her third.

A THIRD STRAIGHT ACC REGULAR SEASON TITLE

With the 68-48 win over Boston College last season, Louisville claimed a third straight ACC regular season title and its first ever outright ACC title. Prior to this stretch, Louisville had never won consecutive regular season conference titles. It also marked UofL's first outright regular season conference title since they won the Conference USA regular season championship in 2000-01. It marks their 8th conference title.

LOUISVILLE PICKED FIRST IN ACC PRESEASON POLLS

UofL was picked first in the league after winning three straight regular season titles. The Cardinals received 45 of 57 first-place votes from the Blue Ribbon Panel for a total of 840 points and 13 of 15 first-place votes from the head coaches to finish with 223 points to lead the voting. Louisville was chosen as the preseason favorite for the second consecutive season.

EVANS NAMED ACC PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR, SMITH AND VAN LITH TO NEWCOMER WATCH LIST

Dana Evans was named ACC Preseason Player of the Year and Preseason First Team All-ACC, while Kianna Smith and Hailey Van Lith were named to the Newcomer Watch List.

■ **Evans** - Evans was named 2019-20 ACC Player of the Year last year and she is the consensus ACC Preseason Player of the Year entering this season.

■ **Smith** - Smith is entering her first season at Louisville after transferring from California. She sat out last season due to NCAA transfer protocols. In two seasons at Cal, she scored 600 points, knocked down 91 3-pointers and dished out 244 assists, while helping the Bears to two 20-win seasons and two trips to the NCAA Tournament.

■ **Van Lith** - Van Lith comes to Louisville as the No. 2 prospect in the country by Prospect Nation and No. 7 overall by ESPN Hoop Gurlz. Following her senior campaign at Cashmere High School, she was named a McDonald's All-American, Jersey Mike's Naismith National High School All-American and 2020 Gatorade and MaxPreps Washington Player of the Year.

EVANS NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE YEAR, WBCA ALL-AMERICAN

Dana Evans was named ACC Player of the Year, All-ACC First Team, All-ACC Academic Team and All-ACC Tournament Team. She is the first player in ACC history to go from Sixth Player of the Year to ACC Player of the Year. She was named one of 10 WBCA All-Americans, joining Angel McCoughtry and Asia Durr as one of three WBCA All-Americans in program history.

DE-FENSE, DE-FENSE

In 18 ACC games last season, Louisville held opponents to 55.0 points per game, which led the league. On the season, UofL gave up 56.4 points per game, which ranked second in the ACC, and held opponents to 70 points or less in all but one game.

■ UofL has led the ACC in scoring defense in league play the last three seasons (2019-20 - 55.0 ppg allowed; 2018-19 - 54.1 ppg allowed; 2017-18 - 55.1 ppg allowed).

LAST YEAR'S SENIOR CLASS SETS NEW STANDARD

With the 70-53 win over Virginia Tech on Senior Day, Bionca Dunham, Jazmine Jones, Jessica Laemmle and Kylee Shook became the third straight senior class to conclude their career as the most accomplished class in program history. They concluded their career with a 125-19 (.868) record, which eclipsed the 123 wins from the 2018-19 class. They also set the program record for winning percentage and fewest losses. Despite not being able to compete in the NCAA Tournament last season, last year's class will finish with a 9-3 all-time record in the NCAA Tournament, just two tournament wins shy of setting the program-record for wins in a four-year period. The record is 11 by the 2015-16, 2014-15 and 2013-14 classes. They had the opportunity to be the first class in program history to advance to the Sweet 16 all four years, but with the NCAA Tournament being canceled did not have that chance.

WALZ NAMED USA BASKETBALL NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Louisville head coach Jeff Walz was recognized prior to the game vs. the USA Women's National Team last season as the recipient of the 2019 USA Basketball National Coach of the Year. Walz led the USA Basketball team to a perfect 7-0 record and a gold medal at the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup in Bangkok, Thailand. With Walz at the helm, the USA U19 women topped its competition by an average of 25.2 points per game, including beating Australia 74-70 in overtime in the gold medal contest.

MELTING POT

Louisville's 2020-21 roster continues last year's pattern of being diverse. Of the 12 student-athletes on its roster, seven are from different states (California, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, North Carolina, Tennessee, Washington). Norika Konno is from Sendai, Japan, Merissah Russell is from Ottawa, Ontario, while Elizabeth Balogun was born in Lagos, Nigeria.

CARDINALS WELCOME IN COCHRAN, RUSSELL, SMITH, VAN LITH WILLIAMS

UofL welcomed in the No. 5 recruiting class in the nation per ESPN HoopGurlz with freshmen Olivia Cochran, Merissah Russell, Hailey Van Lith and Malea Williams, along with junior college transfer Ahlana Smith

■ **Cochran**, a McDonald's All-American, comes to Louisville as the No. 18-ranked player in the class of 2020, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. The five-star prospect is tabbed as the fourth-best player at the forward position. She was named to the 2020 Naismith Trophy Girls High School Player of the Year Preseason Watch List.

■ **Russell** is ranked as the 29th best guard by ESPN. She is listed as a four-star prospect by Prospects Nation and is rated No. 54 overall by PASS Scouting Service. She is a member of Canada's Senior National team and participated as the youngest player on the roster in a five-game European exhibition tour in Belgium and Great Britain.

■ **Smith** was named the 2019-20 NJCAA Division I Women's Basketball Player of the Year after leading Gulf Coast State with 20.3 points and 2.7 steals per game, while also recording 4.8 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game. She led Gulf Coast State to a 23-5 record, including an undefeated 11-win mark at home.

■ **Van Lith**, a McDonald's All-American, comes to Louisville as the No. 2 prospect in the nation by Prospect Nation and No. 7 overall by ESPN HoopGurlz. In addition, she was a 2020 Naismith Trophy Player of the Year Finalist and was 2020 Gatorade and MaxPreps Player of the Year in the state of Washington. As a senior, she helped lead Cashmere High School to a 24-1 record and a trip to the WIAA 2020 Girls Basketball Hardwood Classic 1A championship game. She averaged 33.8 points, 9.5 rebounds and 4.7 assists per game.

■ **Williams** was named Kentucky Association of Basketball Coaches Region 11 Player of the Year and to the Kentucky All-State Girls Basketball Team. During her senior season, she averaged 19.6 points, 13.6 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.8 steals per game.

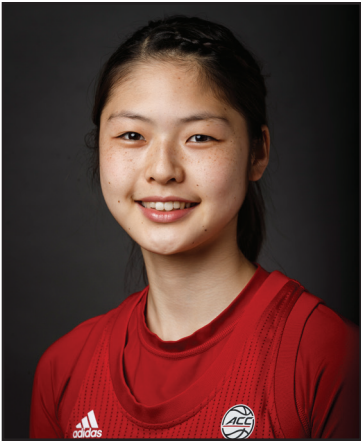
