

STARTING FIVE

- Hailey Van Lith was named ACC Freshman of the Week after averaging 16.5 points and 9.5 rebounds, and shooting 52 percent from the floor and 6-12 from deep, in her first two games at UofL. She is the first UofL women's basketball player to earn ACC Freshman of the Week honors since Asia Durr did so on Feb. 1, 2016. In her first collegiate game, a 74-53 win at Southeast Missouri, she had 13 points and tied for the team-lead with eight rebounds. Then in her home debut, she put up a double-double with 20 points and 11 rebounds, while shooting 5-9 from beyond the arc.
- Van Lith tied Dana Evans with a team-high 20 points in the win over EKU and is the first UofL freshman to score 20 points in a game since Asia Durr scored 23 in an 80-75 loss to Syracuse in the ACC Tournament semifinals on March 5, 2016. Durr had four 20-point games that season. She is first freshman with a double-double since Dana Evans had 18 points and 10 assists in an 87-63 win at Kentucky on Dec. 17, 2017.
- UofL won 101-58 against EKU on Sunday, marking the first time since 102-62 win over UT Martin on Dec. 4, 2018 that they have reached 100 points.
- UofL went 96-11 (.897) over the past three seasons, which marks the fewest losses and best winning percentage over a three-year span in program history. Despite not getting an opportunity to play in the NCAA Tournament last season, the 96 wins over the previous three years rank second all-time to the 97 (97-15) they won during the 2016-17, 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons.
- Head coach Jeff Walz (361-104) is the winningest coach in program history; directing the Cards to 11 NCAA Tournament appearances, including nine Sweet 16's, five Elite Eight's, three trips to the Final Four (2009, 2013, 2018) and two appearances in the national title game (2009, 2013). Prior to his arrival, the Cardinals had never reached a Sweet 16.

ABOUT THE BLUE DEMONS

DePaul is 1-1 on the young season with a narrow 93-91 loss to No. 12 Texas A&M and a record-setting 128-66 win over Chicago State. In the win over Chicago State, six players scored in double figures as the Blue Demons scored a record 128 points. The previous all-time mark had been 124 points against Savannah State in 2018. Last season, the Blue Demons went 28-5 and won the Big East Conference tournament title. They ranked No. 9 among all NCAA Division I programs in forcing turnovers. Juniors Sonya Morris was honored with the Big East Most Improved Player Award and a spot on the All-Big East Second Team while junior Lexi Held was All-Big East Honorable Mention and was voted the Big East Tournament Most Outstanding Player after her career-high 31 points led DePaul past Marquette for a three-peat title. Both have garnered national acclaim with Morris being recognized as a candidate for the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award while Held was named to the Citizen Naismith Trophy watch list.

- Series History Louisville trails the all-time series against DePaul 15-17 and the Cardinals are 0-2 in neutral site games. The former conference rivals played every year from 1995-96 to 2012-13. They last squared off in the second round of the 2016 NCAA Tournament at the KFC Yum! Center with Louisville falling 73-72.
- The Last Meeting (March. 20, 2016) Briahanna Jackson had a team-high 20 points, and Mariya Moore added 14 points and 10 rebounds, but third-seeded Louisville dropped a 73-72 decision to DePaul in the NCAA Tournament second round. Asia Durr added 15 points off the bench, and Myisha Hines-Allen finished with 14 points and nine rebounds, though, the Cardinals were unable to overcome an eight-point halftime deficit.

FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTE

True freshmen Hailey Van Lith (16.5 ppg), Olivia Cochran (16.0 ppg) and Merissah Russell (6.0) are contributing 44 percent of Louisville's 87.5 points through the first two games. In addition, they are crashing the glass as Van Lith (9.5 rpg) and Cochran (6.5 rpg) rank first and second on the team in rebounds and with Russell's 4.5 rebounds per game, the trio is accounting for 37.8 percent of the team's 54.0 rebounds per game.

■ The trio combined to score 38 points (Cochran 17, Van Lith 13, Merissah Russell 8) in the win over SEMO, contributing 51.4 percent of the 74 points scored. Cochran and Van Lith also led the way with eight rebounds, while Russell added five, meaning true freshmen combined for 21 of the Cardinals 50 rebounds, good for 42 percent.

NEWBIES IN THE OPENER

In the win over SEMO, Hailey Van Lith and Olivia Cochran became the first freshmen to start the season opener since Cierra Johnson started in a 100-57 win at UT Martin to begin the 2016-17 season. They are the first duo to start a season opener since Myisha Hines-Allen and Mariya Moore both started in an 89-69 win at IUPUI in 2014-15. Cochran led all scorers with 17 points, while Van Lith chipped in 13 - both becoming the first freshmen to score in double digits in the season opener since Asia Durr scored 12 points in a 75-71 loss to California to open the 2015-16 season. They are the first freshmen duo to both score in double figures in their debut since Moore had 22 and Hines-Allen had 11 in 2014-15.

RETURNING SHOOTERS

Louisville returns its two top 3-point shooters from last season with Dana Evans and Elizabeth Balogun. The duo made 125 of the 202 made 3-pointers last season, which accounted for 61.9 percent of their made threes. Evans led the ACC with 90 made 3-pointers and shot 43.1 percent, while Balogun made 35 and shot 32.1 percent.

GIVE ME FIVE

Louisville returns just five players that saw game action a year ago - Evans, juniors Elizabeth Balogun, Elizabeth Dixon and Mykasa Robinson, along with sophomore Norika Konno. Evans and Robinson are lone players with three or more years of experience with the Cardinals as Evans enters her fourth season and Robinson her third.

RETURNING STARTERS

The Cardinals return two starters from a year ago (Dana Evans, Elizabeth Balogun). Evans started 29 of 30 games played. She has 35 career starts and is UofL's active leader. Balogun started 26 of 28 games played last season. Elizabeth Dixon made four starts last season, while Mykasa Robinson made three starts a season ago and has five career starts at Louisville. Kianna Smith made 64 starts in 65 games in her two years at Cal, while Balogun and Dixon started all 30 games during their freshman season at Georgia Tech.

LOUISVILLE PICKED FIRST IN ACC PRESEASON POLLS

UofL was picked first in the league after winning three straight regular season titles. The Cardinals received 45 of 57 first-place votes from the Blue Ribbon Panel for a total of 840 points and 13 of 15 first-place votes from the head coaches to finish with 223 points to lead the voting. Louisville was chosen as the preseason favorite for the second consecutive season.

EVANS NAMED ACC PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR, SMITH AND VAN LITH TO NEWCOMER WATCH LIST

Dana Evans was named ACC Preseason Player of the Year and Preseason First Team All-ACC, while Kianna Smith and Hailey Van Lith were named to the Newcomer Watch List.

- Evans Evans was named 2019-20 ACC Player of the Year last year and she is the consensus ACC Preseason Player of the Year entering this season.
- Smith Smith is entering her first season at Louisville after transferring from California. She sat out last season due to NCAA transfer protocols. In two seasons at Cal, she scored 600 points, knocked down 91 3-pointers and dished out 244 assists, while helping the Bears to two 20-win seasons and two trips to the NCAA Tournament.
- Van Lith Van Lith comes to Louisville as the No. 2 prospect in the country by Prospect Nation and No. 7 overall by ESPN Hoop Gurlz. Following her senior campaign at Cashmere High School, she was named a McDonald's All-American, Jersey Mike's Naismith National High School All-American and 2020 Gatorade and MaxPreps Washington Player of the Year.

HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ

Head coach Jeff Walz, in his 14th season as a head coach, has compiled a 361-104 (.776) record as the Cardinals' leader. He has led Louisville to nine NCAA Sweet 16 appearances, five Elite 8's, three trips to Final 4 (2009, 2013, 2018), two of which culminated with NCAA runner-up finishes (2009, 2013). Walz, who is averaging 27.6 wins per season, became the winningest coach in program history in 2013-14. He also has the most 20-win seasons in school history (12) and the top-



seven entries for most victories in a season (36 in 2017-18, 34 in 2008-09; 33 in 2013-14; 32 in 2018-19; 29 in 2012-13 and 2016-17, 28 in 2019-20).

Hired on March 27, 2007, the Bluegrass State native took the program to its first NCAA Sweet 16 and it culminated with Louisville earning the No. 12 ranking in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. For his efforts, Walz was named the WBCA Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the reins at Louisville, Walz spent time on four other coaching staffs: Western Kentucky (1996-97), Nebraska (1997-01), Minnesota (2001-02), and Maryland (2002-07). He helped Maryland win the program's first national title in 2006.

FINISHING WITH 28 WINS

Last year, for the second straight season, Louisville entered postseason play with 27 wins. Despite the NCAA Tournament not taking place, their 28 wins rank seventh all-time in program history. The top seven and 10 of the 11 top win totals in program history have come under Walz.

ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

UofL has recorded at least 20 wins for 10 straight seasons to extend the program record. The longest run previously was three, achieved twice. The

SUCCESS AGAINST UNRANKED TEAMS

UofL is 2-0 against unranked teams and 122-2 in their last 123 games. They went 25-2 against unranked teams last year. Prior to the 67-60 loss at Ohio State, they had won 102 consecutive games against teams not ranked in the AP Top 25. Their previous loss to an unranked team was a 79-66 setback vs. Dayton on 11/29/15.

PRESEASON AP AND USA TODAY RANKINGS

UofL was ranked fifth in the AP 2020-21 preseason poll, which equals its highest ever ranking in the poll. The Cardinals received 597 points, 66 points shy of fourth place Baylor. They were also picked fifth in the USA Today poll with 663 points, 39 points shy of fourth place Baylor. UofL also was picked fifth in the preseason AP poll in 2013-14, 2016-17 and 2018-19.

■ Staying Top 10 - UofL has remained in the AP Top 10 for 61 straight polls and the USA Today Top 10 for 60 straight polls, both program records. Louisville had remained in the AP Top 5 for 38 consecutive weeks (Nov. 13, 2017-March 18, 2019) prior to being picked ninth in last year's preseason poll. They were in the USA Today Top 5 for 36 consecutive weeks (Nov. 27, 2017-March 18, 2019) before being picked sixth in 2018-19's final poll.

UOFL'S SUCCESS BY DECADES

In the 10-year stretch that began with the 2010-11 season, UofL finished with a 285-71 (.801) mark, which is the best 10-year stretch in program history, surpassing the 213 wins (213-107, .666) in the 2000's.

APPROACHING MILESTONES

- Evans Moves Up On Scoring List Evans has 1,148 career points, which ranks 22nd all-time in program history. She is 37 points away from tying
- Joan Dunaway Burks (1977-81) for 21st all-time with 1,185 points.
- Evans From The Stripe- Evans is shooting 84.9 percent for her career from the free throw line, which ranks second to Kristin Maddox's 85.2 percent (1992-96) for the best in program history.
- Evans From Deep- Evans has 155 career made 3-pointers, which is just two away from tying Marla Inman Eltrevoog (1994-97) for 10th all-time in program history with 157.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Dana Evans After being named a WBCA All-American and ACC Player of the Year a season ago, Evans has racked up the preseason honors leading into her senior season. She is one of five Associated Press Preseason All-Americans, ACC Preseason Player of the Year, Preseason First Team All-ACC, while being named to the Naismith Award, Wooden Award and Dyrsdale Award Watch Lists.

WIN OVER NO. 1

UofL's 72-62 win over No. 1 Oregon last season marked its second ever win over a No. 1 team, first since their 82-81 victory over No. 1 Baylor in the 2013 NCAA Tournament. The Cards are 2-11 all-time against AP No. 1 teams (1-0 vs. Baylor, 1-0 vs. Oregon, 0-10 vs. UConn, 0-1 vs. Notre Dame).

MOVING UP TO NO. 2 IN BOTH POLLS

Last season, UofL moved up six spots in the AP poll to No. 2 and seven spots in the USA Today poll to No. 2 following their win over No. 1 Oregon. It matched their highest ever ranking in both polls. Four other times Louisville has been ranked second in the AP poll, three times in 2018-19 and once in 2017-18. Five other times, they have been second in the USA Today, three times in 2018-19, once in 2017-18 and at the end of the 2008-09 season.

TOP FIVE WINS

Louisville went 2-0 against Top 5 teams in 2019-20 and Walz has 12 wins against top five teams in his tenure.

VS. AP TOP 25

UofL went 3-2 against AP Top 25 teams last year. Overall, Walz has 63 wins over AP Top 25 teams and 52 in the last 10 years.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

All-time, Walz is 160-34 record (.825) against non-conference foes. UofL went 11-1 in non-conference play last season and had a 21-game non-conference winning streak prior to the loss at Ohio State. Their previous loss was a 69-58 loss at No. 1 UConn on 2/12/18. They are 40-2 in non-conference play over the past four years. They finished undefeated in non-conference play (13-0) in 2018-19 and it marked the first time in program history that they finished regular season play unbeaten out of league play.

A THIRD STRAIGHT ACC REGULAR SEASON TITLE

With the 68-48 win over Boston College last season, Louisville claimed a third straight ACC regular season title and its first ever outright ACC title. Prior to this stretch, Louisville had never won consecutive regular season conference titles. It also marked UofL's first outright regular season conference title since they won the Conference USA regular season championship in 2000-01. It marks their 8th conference title.

LAST YEAR'S SENIOR CLASS SETS NEW STANDARD

With the 70-53 win over Virginia Tech on Senior Day, Bionca Dunham, Jazmine Jones, Jessica Laemmle and Kylee Shook became the third straight senior class to conclude their career as the most accomplished class in program history. They concluded their career with a 125-19 (.868) record, which eclipsed the 123 wins from the 2018-19 class. They also set the program record for winning percentage and fewest losses. Despite not being able to compete in the NCAA Tournament last season, last year's class will finish with a 9-3 all-time record in the NCAA Tournament, just two tournament wins shy of setting the program-record for wins in a four-year period. The record is 11 by the 2015-16, 2014-15 and 2013-14 classes. They had the opportunity to be the first class in program history to advance to the Sweet 16 all four years, but with the NCAA Tournament being canceled did not have that chance.

EVANS NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE YEAR, WBCA ALL-AMERICAN

Dana Evans was named ACC Player of the Year, All-ACC First Team, All-ACC Academic Team and All-ACC Tournament Team. She is the first player in ACC history to go from Sixth Player of the Year to ACC Player of the Year. She was named one of 10 WBCA All-Americans, joining Angel McCoughtry and Asia Durr as one of three WBCA All-Americans in program history. In addition, she was named AP Second Team All-American, USBWA Second Team All-American, Wooden Award National Ballot, Dawn Staley Midseason Watch List, Citizen Naismith Trophy Semifinalist, Ann Meyers Drysdale Finalist and Wade Trophy Midseason Watch List.

■ She played in 30 games with 29 starts, leading the team with 18.0 points 4.2 assists and 90 made 3-pointers. She made 90 3-pointers last season, which ranked 8th all-time in program history. She was six away from tying Shoni Schimmel (2012-13) and Asia Durr (2018-19) for sixth with 96. She led the league and ranked 12th in the country with 90 made 3-pointers, shot 43.1 percent from beyond the arc, which led the league and ranked 20th in the NCAA. Overall, she shot 41.6 percent from the floor, which ranked 13th in the ACC. Her 10 20-plus point games were tied for fourth in the league. She scored in double figures in 29 of 30 games played and ranked third in the ACC with 18.0 points per game, 17.2 points per game in ACC play ranked fifth. She led the league and ranked 10th in the country with an 89.0 free throw percentage. Her 4.2 assists per game ranked eighth in the ACC and her 1.68 assist-to-turnover ratio ranked fourth. She eclipsed 1,000 points with 18 points against FSU.

70-PLUS POINTS

UofL is 252-23 when surpassing the 70-point plateau under Walz. They have scored 70-plus in both wins this season. They scored 70-plus in 21 games last season and went 21-0 in those games. Their 79-73 loss to Miami in 2018-19 ended a 49-game winning streak when scoring 70-plus points.

50/50

UofL shot above 50 percent seven times last season and went 7-0 in those games. Overall, they boast a 117-1 record when shooting 50 percent or better from the field under Walz. Their lone loss came on Nov. 29, 2008 at Nevada when they shot 50.8 percent (L, 85-82).

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

UofL boasts a 153-17 record (.900) at the KFC Yum! Center. All-time at the venue, UofL holds a plus-22.4 scoring margin. Prior to this season's crowd being limited to 15 percent, Louisville was averaging 9,328 fans per contest and had welcomed over one million and a half fans through the doors of the KFC Yum! Center. UofL had won 14 straight games at the KFC Yum! Center prior to its 67-59 loss to FSU on Feb. 6, 2020.

ROAD WARRIORS

With the win at SEMO, Louisville is 35-4 in true road games over the past four seasons. Last season, UofL went 11-2 in road games and 8-1 in ACC road games. Prior to the loss at Ohio State and Syracuse, their only losses came to No. 1 teams (1/10/19 at No. 1 ND, L, 82-68; 2/12/18 at No. 1 UConn, L, 69-58). Their previous road loss to a non-No. 1 team was an 85-66 setback at No. 7 Notre Dame on 2/16/17. Their previous road loss to an unranked team was a 71-69 loss at Western Kentucky on 11/21/15.

DE-FENSE, DE-FENSE

In 18 ACC games last season, Louisville held opponents to 55.0 points per game, which led the league. On the season, UofL gave up 56.4 points per game, which ranked second in the ACC, and held opponents to 70 points or less in all but one game.

■ UofL has led the ACC in scoring defense in league play the last three seasons (2019-20 - 55.0 ppg allowed; 2018-19 - 54.1 ppg allowed; 2017-18 - 55.1 ppg allowed).

MYKASA CONTRIBUTES

In the final 18 games last season, Mykasa Robinson averaged 3.8 points, 3.9 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 1.2 steals, while shooting 27-49 from the floor, in 20.7 minutes per game. In the first 14 games, she averaged 0.9 points, 1.8 rebounds and 1.4 assists in 13.2 minutes per game. In ACC play, she averaged 3.7 points, 3.8 rebounds and 2.8 assists in 19.7 minutes. She played a career-high 36 minutes and had eight rebounds and eight assists at Pitt and then had career-high seven points, while adding five rebounds, five assists, three steals and just one turnover in 30 minutes vs. Boston College. She had a career-high nine assists in 30 minutes, while addings six points and seven rebounds against Notre Dame.

BALOGUN IS BALLIN'

Elizabeth Balogun ranked eighth in the ACC with 1.2 blocks per game. She set a season-high with 12 rebounds in the win over Virginia on Jan. 23. She scored in double figures 13 times last season. She tied her season-high with 15 points at Clemson, shooting 6-10 and 3-6 from 3-point range. She also added five blocks, five rebounds and three assists, while committing just one turnover. She was 5-6 from 3-point range and scored 15 points in the season opener against WKU and played all 40 minutes, contributing 11 points, in the win over No. 1 Oregon.

■ Balogun played for Nigeria in the 2020 Women's Olympic Qualifying Tournament in Belgrade, Serbia (Feb. 6 - Feb. 9). She had nine points, three steals, two rebounds and two assists in Nigeria's 85-51 win over Mozambique. She averaged 5.0 points and hit two 3's as Nigeria finished third (1-2) in the pool and qualified for the Olympics.

DANA FROM DEEP

In wins at Clemson and BC last season, Dana Evans knocked down a career-high seven 3-pointers. Against BC, she went 7-10 from deep after opening 7 of 8. She shot 7-13 at Clemson. Her seven 3-pointers were the most by a UofL player since Asia Durr knocked down an ACC record 11 3-pointers (11-17) en route to tying her own school record with 47 points in the 92-62 win over NC State on Senior Night on 2/28/19.

WALZ NAMED USA BASKETBALL NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Louisville head coach Jeff Walz was recognized prior to the game vs. the USA Women's National Team last season as the recipient of the 2019 USA Basketball National Coach of the Year. Walz led the USA Basketball team to a perfect 7-0 record and a gold medal at the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup in Bangkok, Thailand, With Walz at the helm, the USA U19 women topped its competition by an average of 25.2 points per game, including beating Australia 74-70 in overtime in the gold medal contest.

MELTING POT

Louisville's 2020-21 roster continues last year's pattern of being diverse. Of the 13 student-athletes on its roster, eight are from different states (California, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, North Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Washington). Norika Konno is from Sendai, Japan, Merissah Russell is from Ottawa, Ontario, while Elizabeth Balogun was born in Lagos, Nigeria.

CARDINALS WELCOME IN COCHRAN, RUSSELL, SMITH, VAN LITH WILLIAMS

UofL welcomed in the No. 5 recruiting class in the nation per ESPN HoopGurlz with freshmen Olivia Cochran, Merissah Russell, Hailey Van Lith and Malea Williams, along with junior college transfer

- Cochran, a McDonald's All-American, comes to Louisville as the No. 18-ranked player in the class of 2020, according to espnW HoopGurlz. The five-star prospect is tabbed as the fourth-best player at the forward position. She was named to the 2020 Naismith Trophy Girls High School Player of the Year Preseason Watch List.
- Russell is ranked as the 29th best guard by espnW. She is listed as a four-star prospect by Prospects Nation and is rated No. 54 overall by PASS Scouting Service. She is a member of Canada's Senior National team and participated as the youngest player on the roster in a five-game European exhibition tour in Belgium and Great Britain.
- Smith was named the 2019-20 NJCAA Division I Women's Basketball Player of the Year after leading Gulf Coast State with 20.3 points and 2.7 steals per game, while also recording 4.8 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game. She led Gulf Coast State to a 23-5 record, including an undefeated 11-win mark at home.
- Van Lith, a McDonald's All-American, comes to Louisville as the No. 2 prospect in the nation by Prospect Nation and No. 7 overall by espnW HoopGurlz. In addition, she was a 2020 Naismith Trophy Player of the Year Finalist and was 2020 Gatorade and MaxPreps Player of the Year in the state of Washington. She averaged 33.8 points, 9.5 rebounds and 4.7 assists per game.
